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SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology for the 2001-2003 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: one (1) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate

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SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology, for personal services and operating expenses of the Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology for the biennial period ending June 30, 2003, the following:

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- 2 SECTION 4. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
- 3 SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES. (A) For all
- 4 appropriations as provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall
- 5 monitor the level of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly
- 6 <u>basis</u>. If any proposed expenditures would cause a fund balance to decline to
- 7 <u>less than fifty percent (50%) of the balance available on July 1, 2001, the</u>
- 8 <u>disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive head of the agency.</u>
- 9 Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the agency
- 10 head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
- 11 State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall
- 12 provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall
- include the following:
- 14 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such
- 15 <u>expendi tures on the fund bal</u> ance.
- 16 2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut or
- any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance.
- 18 3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
- 19 or one-time purchase of capitalized items.
- 20 4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not
- 21 jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
- depletion of the fund balance.
- 23 (B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
- 24 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought
- 25 <u>prior review by the Legislative Council.</u>

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- 27 SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by
- 28 this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made
- 29 available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions
- 30 of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures
- 31 Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and
- 32 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
- 33 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
- 34 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
- 35 with in disbursement of said funds.

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1	SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
2	that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
3	in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
4	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
5	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
6	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
7	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint
8	Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
9	
10	SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
11	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
12	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
13	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2001 is essential to the operation of the
14	agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the
15	event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date
16	of this Act beyond July 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the proper
17	administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an
18	emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
19	immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full
20	force and effect from and after July 1, 2001.
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
