22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 5-41-102, cor	ncerning computer-related crimes,	
23	is amended to read as follows:		
24	5-41-102. Definitions.		
25	As used in this chapter, unless the co	ontext otherwise requires:	
26	(1) "Access" means to instruct,	communicate with, store data in,	
27	or retrieve data from a computer, computer s	system, or computer network;	
28	3 (2) "Computer" means an electro	onic device that performs logical,	
29	arithmetic, and memory functions by manipulating electronic or magnetic		
30	impulses and includes all input, output, processing, storage, computer		
31	1 software, and communication facilities that	software, and communication facilities that are connected or related to that	
32	device in a system or a network;		
33	3 (3) "Computer network" means th	(3) "Computer network" means the interconnection of	
34	communications lines with a computer through remote terminals or a complex		
35	consisting of two (2) or more interconnected computers;		
36	6 (4) "Computer program" means a	set of instructions, statements,	

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- or related data that, in actual or modified form, is capable of causing a computer or a computer system to perform specified functions;
- 3 (5) "Computer software" means one (1) or more computer programs, 4 existing in any form, or any associated operational procedures, manuals, or 5 other documentation;
  - (6) "Computer system" means a set of related, connected, or unconnected computers, other devices, and software;
- (7) "Computer virus" means any computer instruction, information,
  data or program that degrades the performance of a computer resource;
  disables, damages or destroys a computer resource; or attaches itself to
  another computer resource and executes when the host computer program, data or
  instruction is executed or when some other event takes place in the host
  computer resource, data or instruction;
  - (7)(8) "Data" means any representation of information, knowledge, facts, concepts, or instructions which are being prepared or have been prepared and are intended to be processed or stored, are being processed or stored, or have been processed or stored in a computer, computer network, or computer system;
  - (8)(9) "Financial instrument" includes, but is not limited to, any check, draft, warrant, money order, note, certificate of deposit, letter of credit, bill of exchange, credit or debit card, transaction authorization mechanism, marketable security, or any computer system representation thereof;
  - $\frac{(9)}{(10)}$  In this subchapter, "message" means any transfer of signs, signals, writing, images, sounds, data, or intelligence of any nature, or any transfer of a computer program.
  - (10)(11) "Property" includes, but is not limited to, financial instruments, data, computer programs, documents associated with computers and computer programs, or copies thereof, whether tangible or intangible, including both human and computer readable data, and data while in transit;
- 30 (11)(12) "Services" includes, but is not limited to, the use of a 31 computer, a computer system, a computer network, computer software, a computer 32 program, or data.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 5-41-104, concerning computer-related crimes, is amended to read as follows:

5-41-104. Computer trespass.

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1	(a) $\underline{(1)}$ Any person commits computer trespass who intentionally and	
2	without authorization accesses, alters, deletes, damages, destroys, or	
3	disrupts any computer, computer system, computer network, computer program, or	
4	data.	
5	(b)(2) Computer trespass is a Class C misdemeanor if it is a first	
6	violation which does not cause any loss or damage.	
7	$\frac{(c)}{(3)}$ Computer trespass is a Class B misdemeanor if:	
8	$\frac{(1)}{(A)}$ It is a second or subsequent violation which does not	
9	cause any loss or damage; or	
10	$\frac{(2)}{(B)}$ It is a violation which causes loss or damage of less than	
11	five hundred dollars (\$500).	
12	$\frac{(d)}{(4)}$ Computer trespass is a Class A misdemeanor if it is a violation	
13	which causes loss or damage of five hundred dollars (\$500) or more, but less	
14	than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500).	
15	$\frac{(e)}{(5)}$ Computer trespass is a Class D felony if it is a violation which	
16	causes loss or damage of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or more.	
17	(b)(1) Any person commits aggravated computer trespass who	
18	intentionally, knowingly and without authorization:	
19	(A) Introduces or allows the introduction of a computer	
20	virus into any computer system, network or resource; or	
21	(B) Publishes a password, identifying code, personal	
22	identification number or other confidential information about a computer,	
23	computer system, computer network or data base.	
24	(2) Aggravated computer trespass is a Class D felony.

26	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 5-41-106(a), concerning computer-related	
27	crimes, is amended to read as follows:	
28	(a) Any person whose property or person is injured by reason of a	
29	violation of any provision of this chapter may sue therefor and recover for	
30	any damages sustained and the costs of suit. Without limiting the generality	
31	of the term, "damages" shall include loss of profits <u>for the time that the</u>	
32	system was not usable, the cost of repairing or replacing the system or any of	
33	its components, and the cost of replacing or restoring any lost or damaged	
34	<u>data</u> .	
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
