Arkansas Code 24-11-819(a)(2)(B), concerning the additional 25 26 benefit for disabled firefighters "injured in the line of duty" under a 27 firemen's pension and relief fund, is amended to read as follows: (B)(i) For a full-paid fire fighter who is injured in the 28 29 line of duty, the monthly disability benefit shall either be equal to sixtyfive percent (65%) of the salary attached to the rank held by the member in 30 31 the fire department or shall be equal to the benefit paid to normal service 32 retirants, whichever is greater. 33 (ii)(a) For purposes of this section, "injured in the line of duty" means a disabling injury or disease which occurs while 34 35 conducting official fire department operations or while in training to become 36 a fire fighter.

1	(b) The board shall determine whether the
2	disability occurred in the line of duty, and may require any medical evidence,
3	official reports, expert testimony, or other information to be supplied by the
4	applicant, in addition to the required physician's examination and report.
5	(iii)(a) The additional benefits provided in this
6	section shall be effective for all qualifying applications first received by
7	the board on or after January 1, 1987, except that the board of trustees of
8	any municipal firemen's pension and relief fund or of the Local Police and
9	Fire Retirement System may increase the benefits for any disabled fire fighter
10	injured in the line of duty before January 1, 1987 but after January 1, 1983
11	if the board adopts a resolution to extend the benefit retroactively back to
12	those fire fighters and if the fund will remain actuarially sound as
13	determined by actuary for the Arkansas Fire and Police Pension Review Board or
14	the Local Police and Fire Retirement System.
15	(b) The disability benefit provided herein
16	shall continue to be paid to the fire fighter so long as he is retired and
17	shall not be reduced to the regular service annuity amount, if less, when he
18	reaches his normal retirement age.
19	(iv) Upon the death of the retirant, any survivor
20	benefits shall be based upon the normal service retirement annuity amount.
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22	SECTION 2. This act applies retroactively to authorize the board of
23	trustees of the Local Police and Fire Retirement System or of any municipal
24	firemen's pension and relief fund which will remain actuarially sound to allow
25	a fire fighter who was disabled from an injury in the line of duty after
26	January 1, 1983, but before January 1, 1987, to receive the benefit of sixty-
27	five percent (65%) of the salary attached to his rank, except that benefit
28	payments shall not be made retroactive to the effective date of the fire
29	<u>fighter's disability.</u>
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31	SECTION 3. [THE ARKANSAS CODE REVISION COMMISSION IS NOT REQUIRED TO
32	CODIFY THIS SECTION.] <u>No benefit enhancement provided for by this act shall</u>
33	be implemented if it would cause the publicly supported retirement system's
34	unfunded actuarial accrued liabilities to exceed a thirty (30) year
35	amortization. No benefit enhancement provided for by this act shall be
36	implemented by any publicly supported system which has unfunded actuarial

1	accrued liabilities being amortized over a period exceeding thirty (30) years
2	until the unfunded actuarial accrued liability is reduced to a level less than
3	the standards prescribed by Arkansas Code, Title 24.
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5	SECTION 4. Emergency Clause. It is found and determined by the
6	Eighty-third General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain disabled
7	individuals under a firemen's pension and relief fund were injured in the line
8	of duty before January 1, 1987; that this has worked a financial hardship and
9	an inequity on individuals who were injured before the benefit was given to
10	those fire fighters after January 1, 1987; and that certain individuals who
11	were never granted benefits under this provision of law should have those
12	benefits restored as soon as possible and to have this act applied
13	retroactively to those individuals. Therefore an emergency is declared to
14	exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
15	public peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its
16	approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the
17	Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time
18	during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the
19	Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the
20	last house overrides the veto.
