23	benefits for municipal police and fire departments; that effective July 1,		
24	1997, the Public Employees' Retirement System ended special credited service		
25	for police officers; that the rigors of police work need to be recognized as		
26	special by a specialized retirement system; and that it is now necessary to		
27	allow for the transfer of those departments to the Local Police and Fire		
28	Retirement where that special service can be recognized. Therefore, an		
29	emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for		
30	the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective		
31	on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved		
32	nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the		
33	period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is		
34	vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective		
35	on the date the last house overrides the veto.
