Arkansas Code 24-12-123(a)(3), concerning the retirement 23 benefits for mayors of cities of the first class, is amended to read as 24 follows: 25 (3) However, mayors who have served as an elected official or 26 employee of that city or served as a public school teacher prior to or after 27 their service as mayor shall count their service as an elected official or employee of that city or as <u>a public school teacher</u> at the rate of one (1) 28 29 year for mayor's retirement for each two (2) years served as an elected 30 official or an employee of that city or as a teacher with a maximum of an 31 additional two (2) years' credit towards mayor's retirement. 32 33 SECTION 2. [THE ARKANSAS CODE REVISION COMMISSION IS NOT REQUIRED TO CODIFY THIS SECTION.] No benefit enhancement provided for by this act shall 34 35 be implemented if it would cause the publicly supported retirement system's 36 unfunded actuarial accrued liabilities to exceed a thirty (30) year

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1	allor treation. No benefit enhancement provided for by this act sharr be
2	implemented by any publicly supported system which has unfunded actuarial
3	accrued liabilities being amortized over a period exceeding thirty (30) years
4	until the unfunded actuarial accrued liability is reduced to a level less than
5	the standards prescribed by Arkansas Code, Title 24.
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7	SECTION 3. <u>EMERGENCY CLAUSE</u> . It is found and determined by the General
8	Assembly that former public school teachers often serve as mayors in
9	municipalities in Arkansas; that the service as a former teacher provided
10	valuable background knowledge to aid the mayor in the performance of his job
11	as a public official; that time in public education should count towards the
12	mayor's retirement benefit; and that it is necessary to provide this benefit
13	to former teachers as soon as possible and this act should have immediate
14	effect. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
15	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
16	safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If
17	the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
18	effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
19	may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
20	overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the
21	<u>veto.</u>
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
