9 AN ACT TO REAPPROPRIATE THE BALANCES OF CAPITAL  
10 IMPROVEMENT APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE STATE MILITARY  
11 DEPARTMENT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

15 AN ACT FOR THE STATE MILITARY DEPARTMENT  
16 REAPPROPRIATION.  
17  
18

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
20

21 SECTION 1. REAPPROPRIATION - FEDERAL. There is hereby appropriated, to the  
22 State Military Department, to be payable from the federal funds as designated  
23 by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, for the State Military Department,  
24 the following:

25 (A) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
26 Item (B) of Section 2 of Act 552 of 1999, for construction and related  
27 expenses for a Combined Support Maintenance Shop, in a sum not to exceed  
28 ..... \$11,100,724.

29 (B) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
30 Item (C) of Section 2 of Act 552 of 1999, for construction, major maintenance,  
31 repairs, asphalt paving and associated expenses at various National Guard  
32 Armories including Warren, Mountain Home, West Memphis and an Aviation Armory  
33 at Camp Robinson, in a sum not to exceed ..... \$9,005,269.

34 (C) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
35 Item (D) of Section 2 of Act 552 of 1999, for the construction and related  
36 expenses for an Ammunition Supply Point at Camp Robinson, in a sum not to

1 exceed ..... \$3,544,800.

2 (D) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
3 Item (E) of Section 2 of Act 552 of 1999, for construction and related expense  
4 for a Centralized Vehicle Wash Facility for cleaning heavy/tracked vehicles,  
5 to provide vehicle maintenance for mechanized or tracked units and related  
6 services, in a sum not to exceed ..... \$1,065,500.

7 (E) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
8 Item (F) of Section 2 of Act 552 of 1999, for construction and related  
9 expenses for an Organizational Maintenance Shop in Searcy, Arkansas, in a sum  
10 not to exceed ..... \$1,373,986.

11 (F) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
12 Item (G) of Section 2 of Act 552 of 1999, for construction and related  
13 expenses for additional space to the United States Property and Fiscal Office,  
14 in a sum not to exceed ..... \$566,600.

15 (G) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
16 Item (I) of Section 2 of Act 552 of 1999, for miscellaneous statewide  
17 construction projects, in a sum not to exceed ..... \$500,000.

18 (H) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
19 Item (J) of Section 2 of Act 552 of 1999, for various Training Site  
20 improvement projects, in a sum not to exceed ..... \$500,000.

21 (I) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
22 Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 94 of 1999, for construction and equipping the  
23 National Guard Armory in Benton, Arkansas, in a sum not to exceed ... \$143,046.

24 (J) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
25 Item (C) of Section 1 of Act 94 of 1999, for constructing and equipping the  
26 National Guard Armory in Warren, Arkansas, in a sum not to exceed . \$2,049,535.

27 (K) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
28 Item (D) of Section 1 of Act 94 of 1999, for constructing and equipping a  
29 National Guard Armory and Organizational Maintenance Shop in Hazen, Arkansas,  
30 in a sum not to exceed ..... \$30,191.

31 (L) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
32 Item (E) of Section 1 of Act 94 of 1999, for constructing and equipping a  
33 National Guard Military Operations in Urban Terrain (MOUT) Training Facility,  
34 in a sum not to exceed ..... \$3,575,560.

35 (M) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
36 Item (F) of Section 1 of Act 94 of 1999, for constructing and equipping a

1 National Guard Combined Support Maintenance Shop in Fayetteville, Arkansas, in  
2 a sum not to exceed ..... \$1,970,520.

3 (N) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
4 Item (J) of Section 1 of Act 94 of 1999, for constructing and equipping the  
5 National Guard Organizational Maintenance Shop in Jonesboro, Arkansas, in a  
6 sum not to exceed ..... \$1,970,520.

7 (O) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
8 Item (K) of Section 1 of Act 94 of 1999, for constructing and equipping the  
9 National Guard Organizational Maintenance Shop at Camp Robinson, Arkansas, in  
10 a sum not to exceed ..... \$1,373,986.

11 (P) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
12 Item (L) of Section 1 of Act 94 of 1999, for construction of a hangar and  
13 support facility at the Army Aviation Support Facility at Camp Robinson,  
14 Arkansas, in a sum not to exceed ..... \$15,600,000.

15 (Q) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
16 Item (Q) of Section 1 of Act 94 of 1999, for construction and utility upgrades  
17 by the State Military Department, in a sum not to exceed ..... \$381,070.

18  
19 SECTION 2. REAPPROPRIATION – GENERAL IMPROVEMENT. There is hereby  
20 appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the General  
21 Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, for the State  
22 Military Department, the following:

23 (A) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
24 Item (B) of Section 2 of Act 94 of 1999, for construction, major maintenance,  
25 asphalt paving and associated expenses for the National Guard Armory in  
26 Benton, Arkansas, in a sum not to exceed ..... \$50,364.

27 (B) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
28 Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 552 of 1999, for Phase I and II Armory  
29 Rehabilitation Projects, for major repairs, renovations and construction  
30 related projects for armories, in a sum not to exceed ..... \$1,419,096.

31 (C) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
32 Item (B) of Section 1 of Act 552 of 1999, for construction, major maintenance,  
33 repairs, asphalt paving and associated expenses at various National Guard  
34 Armories including Warren, Mountain Home, West Memphis and an Aviation Armory  
35 at Camp Robinson, in a sum not to exceed ..... \$1,650,000.

36 (D) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in

1 Item (C) of Section 1 of Act 552 of 1999, for work at various locations to  
2 alter existing buildings to meet Americans with Disabilities Act regulations,  
3 work will include but not be limited to ramps, restroom alterations,  
4 passageway alterations, and parking spaces, in a sum not to exceed ..\$174,800.

5 (E) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
6 Item (D) of Section 1 of Act 552 of 1999, for asbestos detection, evaluation  
7 and related services of all armories utilized by the National Guard, in a sum  
8 not to exceed .....\$157,390.

9  
10 SECTION 3. REAPPROPRIATION - ARMORY CONSTRUCTION FUND. There is hereby  
11 appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the Armory  
12 Construction Fund, for the State Military Department, the following:

13 (A) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
14 Item (A) of Section 3 of Act 94 of 1999, for repair, construction, renovation,  
15 landscaping and maintenance of armories, hangars, and other properties held  
16 for the use and benefit of the Arkansas National Guard, in a sum not to exceed  
17 .....\$128,292.

18  
19 SECTION 4. REAPPROPRIATION - CASH. There is hereby appropriated, to the  
20 State Military Department, to be payable from the cash funds as defined by  
21 Arkansas Code 19-4-801, for the State Military Department, the following:

22 (A) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
23 Item (A) of Section 4 of Act 94 of 1999, for construction and construction  
24 related services at the Hazen Armory, Arkansas, in a sum not to exceed  
25 .....\$85,634.

26  
27 SECTION 5. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor  
28 obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects  
29 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available  
30 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and  
31 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and  
32 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or  
33 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State  
34 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects  
35 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds  
36 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General

1 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall  
2 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

3 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing  
4 Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue  
5 Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of this State  
6 and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration,  
7 as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any  
8 funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law.

9  
10 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly  
11 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained  
12 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act  
13 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations  
14 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by  
15 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral  
16 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint  
17 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

18  
19 SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
20 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
21 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that previous  
22 General Assemblies have provided appropriations for the projects provided or  
23 enumerated in this act; that certain appropriations will expire before the  
24 adjournment of the General Assembly; and that if such appropriations expire,  
25 the projects and programs authorized herein will cease thereby depriving the  
26 citizens of the State of the benefits to be derived from such projects.  
27 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
28 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
29 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its  
30 passage and approval. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the  
31 Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time  
32 during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the  
33 Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the  
34 last house overrides the veto.
