AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE WESTARK COLLEGE FOR THE BI ENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 2003; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

AN ACT FOR THE WESTARK COLlege
APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2001-2003
BI ENNI UM.

BE I T ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for the Westark College for the 2001-2003 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annal salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - UNI VERSITY CENTER. There is hereby appropriated, to the Westark College, to be payable from the Westark College Fund, for the operation and expenses of the University Center and the transfer of funds and appropriation to various Arkansas public universities which are approved by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board to offer courses and programs under the auspices of the Center, as deemed appropriate by the Board of Trustees of the Westark College, with the advice of the Director of the Department of Higher Education for the biennial period ending June 30, 2003, the following:

SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE I NCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. UNI QUE DESIGNATION. It is the intent of the General Assembly to limit the designation "unique community college" to Westark because of its location in the heart of the State's largest manacturing center, its enrollment of over 3, 000 full. time equivalent students, and its local millage rate of 5.25 to support the college.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from।uly 1,2001 through June 30, 2003.

SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. Arkansas Code 6-61-1104 is hereby amended to read as follows: "6-61-1104. Baccalaureate degree programs. Westark College is authorized to offer a baccalaureate degree program in Manufacturing Technology and other selected baccalaureate degree programs, not to exceed a total of nine (9) in number. Each baccalaureate
degree program offered by Westark must meet a demonstrated demand of the area and industries served by the college and be designed for completion in less than four (4) years. After the first graduating class, baccalaureate programs that have a job placement rate or graduation rate of fewer than nine (9) students per year for three (3) consecutive years will be dropped. The preponderance of degrees offered by Westark (seventy-five percent (75\%) or more) shall be one-semester certificates of proficiency, one-year technical certificates, and two-year associate of applied science and arts degrees. Westark may continue to contract with other colleges and universities for the offering of courses and programs through the Westark University Center which was approved by the Arkansas General Assembly with the enactment of Act 259 of 1989."

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from uly 1,2001 through June 30, 2003.

SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE I NCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMPLOYMENT MODELS. Westark is hereby authorized to experiment with and utilize employment models other than tenure to accommodate the development and delivery of curriculum, such as the employment of new faculty on a twelve-month, fortyhour week basis, with rewards for administrative staff and faculty based upon results.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from।uly 1,2001 through June 30, 2003.

SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE I NCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLI SHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. Arkansas Code 6-61-1107 is hereby amended to read as follows: "6-61-1107. Administration. Westark College shall continue to be governed by the Board of Trustees of the Sebastian Community Junior College District, utilizing the administrative staff and support services of Westark College."

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from।uly 1,2001 through June 30, 2003.

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    SECTION 10. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES. (A) For al|
appropriations as provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall
monitor the level of fund bal ances in relation to expenditures on a monthly
basis. If any proposed expenditures would cause a fund balance to decline to
less than fifty percent (50%) of the bal ance available on |uly 1, 2001, the
disbursing officer shall i mmediately notify the executive head of the agency.
Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the agency
head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall
provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall
include the following:
1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such
expenditures on the fund bal ance.
2) i nformation clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut or
any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund bal ance.
3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
or one-time purchase of capitalized items.
4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund bal ances will not
Leopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
depletion of the fund bal ance.
(B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought
prior review by the Legislative Council.
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SECTION 11. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Acounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control I aws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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            SECTION 12. LEGI SLATIVE INTENT. It is the i ntent of the General Assembly
that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
the Department of Finance and Admi nistration, letters, or summarized oral
testimony in the official mi nutes of the Arkansas Legi slative Council or Joint
Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
    SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
effectiveness of this Act on \uly 1, 2001 is essential to the operation of the
agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the
event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date
of this Act beyond July 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the proper
administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an
emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full
force and effect from and after duly 1, 2001.
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
