21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for
24 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2001-2003 biennium,
25 the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be
26 governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act
27 (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory
28 thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum
29 annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the
30 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons
31 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of
32 the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-
33 101), or its successor.

 2 Of the funds appropriated in ~~Section 6~~ the appropriations-operations section

13 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ADMISSION
 15 POLICY. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall admit one

 17 biennium into the College of Medicine. Provided that no funds shall be

17 need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No classifications will be

20 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is
21 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by

14 HEALTH AND FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute
15 shall be administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital.
16 Arkansas Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or
17 contract with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences - Department of
18 Pediatrics for services required in delivering the programs of the Child
19 Health and Family Life Institute. The KIDS FIRST Program, a component of the
20 Child Health and Family Life Institute, shall receive priority consideration
21 above all other programs of the Institute when funding decisions are made by
22 Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas Children's Hospital shall make
23 quarterly reports to the Arkansas Legislative Council on matters of funding,
24 existing programs and any new programs and/or services offered through the
25 Child Health and Family Life Institute.

26 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
27 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue, the
28 total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking Services
29 from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

30
31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001
32 through June 30, 2003.

34 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

36 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship

9 Research Fund, which is hereby created on the books of the State Treasurer,

12 (2) Eighty percent (80%) shall be credited to the Breast Cancer Control

20 Medical Sciences shall be the disbursing officer for the Breast Cancer
21 Research Fund.

22 (b) The moneys in the Breast Cancer Research Fund are to be allocated to
23 the Breast Cancer Research Program for the awarding of grants, chairs and
24 contracts to researchers for research with respect to the cause, cure,
25 treatment, prevention, and earlier detection of breast cancer and for
26 developing leadership in research in Arkansas.

27 (c) The moneys in the Breast Cancer Control Fund for the control of breast
28 cancer are to be allocated according to the recommendations of the Breast
29 Cancer Control Advisory Board who shall establish the scope of services of the
30 program and programmatic priorities based on the analysis of available
31 information. The advisory board shall also be responsible for developing
32 eligibility criterion to be applied in evaluating requests for breast cancer
33 control financial assistance from screened women who are found to be in need
34 of diagnostic and treatment services. The advisory board shall also review
35 contractual agreements for breast cancer control with providers who will be
36 rendering services through the program.

2 SECTION 35. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
3 SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES. (A) For all
4 appropriations as provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall
5 monitor the level of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly
6 basis. If any proposed expenditures would cause a fund balance to decline to
7 less than fifty percent (50%) of the balance available on July 1, 2001, the
8 disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive head of the agency.
9 Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the agency
10 head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
11 State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall
12 provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall
13 include the following:
14 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such
15 expenditures on the fund balance.
16 2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut or
17 any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance.
18 3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
19 or one-time purchase of capitalized items.
20 4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not
21 jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
22 depletion of the fund balance.
23 (B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
24 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought
25 prior review by the Legislative Council.

26
27 SECTION 36. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
28 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
29 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
30 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary
31 Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures
32 and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or
33 their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where
34 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and
35 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in
36 disbursement of said funds.

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SECTION 37. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 38. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2001 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2001.
