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## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 12-10-323 TO INCLUDE  
10 THE PURCHASE OF MAPS AND PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF  
11 STREET AND ROAD SIGNS AS AUTHORIZED USES FOR 911  
12 EMERGENCY REVENUES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.  
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## Subtitle

14 TO INCLUDE THE PURCHASE OF MAPS AND  
15 INSTALLATION OF STREET AND ROAD SIGNS AS  
16 AUTHORIZED USES FOR 911 EMERGENCY  
17 REVENUES.  
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 12-10-323(a), concerning the authorized  
24 expenditures for 911 emergency revenues, is amended to read as follows:

25 (a)(1) Any revenue generated pursuant to §§ 12-10-318 - 12-10-321 may  
26 be expended only in direct connection with the provision of 911 services and  
27 only for the following purposes:

28 (A) The engineering, installation, and recurring costs  
29 necessary to implement, operate, and maintain a 911 telephone system;

30 (B) The costs necessary for forwarding and transfer  
31 capabilities of calls from the 911 public safety communication center to  
32 dispatch centers or to other 911 public safety communication centers;

33 (C) Engineering, construction, lease, or purchase costs to  
34 lease, purchase, build, remodel, or refurbish a 911 public safety  
35 communication center and for necessary emergency and uninterruptable power  
36 supplies for the center;

1 (D) Personnel costs in the amount of seventy-five percent  
2 (75%) of the salary and benefits of each position charged with supervision  
3 and operation of the 911 public safety communication center and system;

4 (E) Purchase, lease, operation, and maintenance of  
5 consoles, telephone and communications equipment owned or operated by the  
6 political subdivisions and physically located within and for the use of the  
7 911 public safety communication center, and radio or microwave towers and  
8 equipment with lines which terminate in the center;

9 (F) Purchase, lease, operation, and maintenance of  
10 computers, data processing equipment, associated equipment, and leased audio  
11 or data lines assigned to and operated by the 911 public safety communication  
12 center for the purposes of coordinating, forwarding of calls, dispatch, or  
13 recordkeeping of public safety and private safety agencies for which the 911  
14 public safety communication center is the public safety answering point and  
15 to provide information assistance to those agencies; ~~and~~

16 (G) Supplies, equipment, public safety answering point  
17 personnel training, vehicles, and vehicle maintenance, if such items are  
18 solely and directly related to and incurred by the political subdivision in  
19 mapping, addressing, and readdressing a 911 system-, and the costs necessary  
20 to prepare, produce, and maintain maps and to assign and maintain location  
21 addresses for structures for emergency response purposes; and

22 (H) The purchase, production, installation, and  
23 maintenance of street and road signs that display street and road names or  
24 numbers for emergency response purposes.

25 (2) Nothing in this subsection shall be interpreted or construed  
26 as authorizing a political subdivision to purchase emergency response  
27 vehicles, law enforcement vehicles, or other political subdivision vehicles  
28 from such funds.

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
