26	SECTION 1. The General Assembly finds:

10	SECTION 2. (a) Only physicians who have training in child psychology		
11	and development and training in the use and effects of psychotropic drugs on		
12	children and who follow the regulations promulgated by the Arkansas State		
13	Medical Board may prescribe psychotropic drugs for school children.		
14	(b) Local school district boards and superintendents shall:		
15	(1) Determine the extent to which psychotropic drugs are in use		
16	in their schools and the current processes by which those drugs are being		
17	prescribed for the students, and shall report their findings to the Departmen		
18	of Education; and		
19	(2) Provide information to teachers and parents, including		
20	tutoring, vision testing, phonics, nutritional guidance, medical examinations,		
21	allergy testing, standard disciplinary procedures, and other remedies known to		
22	be effective and harmless in improving student behavior.
