4 (A) Dedicated to educational purposes, located in Arkansas, or located out of state and educating Arkansas residents in 5 6 dentistry, optometry, veterinary medicine, podiatry, chiropractic, or 7 osteopathy under agreement with the Board of Control for Southern Regional 8 Education, accredited by an accrediting agency certified and recognized by 9 the United States Department of Education or the Division of Agency 10 Evaluation and Institutional Accreditation, or a school giving satisfactory 11 assurance that it has the potential for accreditation and is making progress 12 which, if continued, will result in its achieving accreditation;

13 (B) Which does not discriminate in the admission of
14 students on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin; and
15 (C) Which subscribes to the principle of academic freedom;

2 (b) <u>Arkansas Governor's Scholarship recipients</u> Students who exhibit 3 extraordinary academic ability shall be known as Arkansas Governor's 4 Distinguished Scholars. 5

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 6-82-306 is amended to read as follows: 6-82-306. Eligibility.

8 (a) The Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program scholarships are to be
9 awarded to those students who demonstrate the highest capabilities for

Number and geographic distribution of scholarships. 14 (1) The If sufficient funds are available, effective for students receiving their initial awards beginning in fall, 2001, the number of initial 15 16 scholarship awards to eligible high achievers shall not exceed three one hundred <u>twenty-five</u> (300)(125) each year, to be distributed as follows: 17 18 (A) One hundred (100) Governor's Distinguished Scholarships 19 capped at ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per year; and 20 (B) Twenty five (25) Governor's Scholarships at four thousand 21 dollars (\$4,000) per year. 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4	SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
5	General Assembly that the state does not have the funds to support the
6	Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program in its current form; and that applicants
7	graduating after December 31, 2000, will experience uncertainty regarding
8 9	eligibility for the Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program; and that many
9 10	applicants may be delayed in beginning their post-secondary education unless changes in the scholarship program become effective in sufficient time to
10	allow scholarship awards to be made to those students needing to make
12	enrollment decisions for the 2001-2002 academic year. Therefore, an
12	emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for
14	the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become
15	effective on March 1, 2001.
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
