- 8 (2) The financial scholarship shall be two thousand dollars 9 (\$2,000) per year.
- (e) As a condition for approval to participate in the program, the
 institution of higher education shall agree to classify teachers who relocate
 within Arkansas from out-of-state in order to participate in the program as
 residents of the state for tuition purposes.
 - (f)(1) Students awarded financial scholarships under the University

 Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program may receive the

 awards for a maximum of four (4) school years.

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- (2) The maximum number of awards which may be made shall not exceed the length of time required to complete the number of academic hours necessary to obtain a Master of Education degree.
- (g) Financial scholarships under the program shall not be based upon an applicant's eligibility for financial aid.
 - (h)(1) Persons relocating to a geographical area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the State Board of Education, to participate in the University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program shall be eligible for reimbursement from the State Board of Education for all or part of their moving expenses to the critical teacher shortage area.
 - (2) The Department of Higher Education shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the administration of the relocation expense reimbursement component of the University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program.
- (i) Subject to the availability of funds, the State Board of Education
 may provide for professional development and support services as may be
 necessary for the retention of teachers participating in the program in those
 geographical areas of the state where there exists a critical shortage of
 teachers.

1 (j) Any person participating in the program who fails to complete a 2 program of study that will enable that person to obtain a Master of Education 3 degree shall become liable immediately to the State Board of Education for the 4 sum of all awards made to that person under the program, plus interest 5 accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate at the time the person abrogates participation in the program. 6 7 (k) As a condition for participation in the program, a teacher shall 8 agree to employment as a licensed teacher in a school district located in a 9 geographical area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of 10 teachers, as designated by the State Board of Education, for a period of not 11 less than three (3) years, which shall include those years of service rendered while obtaining the Master of Education degree or Educational Specialist 12 13 degree. (I)(1)(i) Students receiving an award from the University Assisted 14 15 Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program shall execute a note made 16 payable to the Department of Higher Education for an amount equal to the award 17 each semester that shall bear interest at the rate of ten percent (10%) per year beginning September 1 after completion of the program, or immediately 18 19 after termination of the student's participation in the program, whichever is 20 earl i er. 21 (ii) Students in the University Assisted Teacher Recruitment 22 and Retention Grant Program who receive reimbursement for moving expenses 23 under subsection (h) of this section shall execute a note made payable to the 24 Department of Education for an amount equal to the reimbursement that shall 25 bear interest at the rate of ten percent (10%) per year. 26 (2) Any person failing to complete a program of study which will 27 enable the person to become a licensed teacher shall begin repaying the note 28 according to the note's terms for the sum of all awards made to that person 29 less the corresponding amount of any awards for which service has been 30 rendered. 31 (3) Any person failing to complete their teaching obligation, as 32 required under subsection (k) of this section, shall begin repaying the notes 33 according to the notes' terms for the sum of all awards made to that person less the corresponding amount of any awards for which service has been 34 35 rendered, except in the case of a deferral of debt for cause approved by the State Board of Education if there is no employment position immediately 36

21	Program.		
22	(p) The Department of Higher Education is authorized to determine the		
23	necessary procedures for the awarding of grants should the number of eligible		
24	applicants and recipients exceed the funds available.
