9 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
10 FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION - DISBURSING OFFICER FOR
11 COSTS OF PURCHASING EQUIPMENT, EXPANDING AND UPGRADING
12 THE FACILITIES OF VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENTS IN
13 WASHINGTON AND CRAWFORD COUNTIES; AND FOR OTHER
14 PURPOSES.

25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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27 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS - VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENTS - WASHINGTON AND
28 CRAWFORD COUNTIES. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Finance
29 and Administration - Disbursing Officer, to be payable from the General
30 Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, the following:

31 (A) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
32 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the Wheeler Volunteer Fire
33 Department, the sum of \$15,000.

34 (B) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
35 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the Boston Mountain Volunteer Fire
36 Department, the sum of \$15,000.

1 (C) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
2 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the Evansville Volunteer Fire
3 Department, the sum of\$15,000.

4 (D) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
5 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the Farmington/Prairie Grove
6 Volunteer Fire Department, the sum of\$15,000.

7 (E) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
8 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the Lincoln Volunteer Fire
9 Department, the sum of\$15,000.

10 (F) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
11 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the Morrow Volunteer Fire
12 Department, the sum of\$15,000.

13 (G) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
14 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the Strickler Volunteer Fire
15 Department, the sum of\$15,000.

16 (H) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
17 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the West Fork Volunteer Fire
18 Department, the sum of\$15,000.

19 (I) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
20 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the Natural Dam Volunteer Fire
21 Department, the sum of\$15,000.

22 (J) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
23 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the White House Volunteer Fire
24 Department, the sum of\$15,000.

25 (K) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
26 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the Round Mountain Volunteer Fire
27 Department, the sum of\$15,000.

28 (L) For costs of expanding and upgrading the facilities of and to assist in
29 the purchase of fire fighting equipment by the Wedington Volunteer Fire
30 Department, the sum of\$15,000.

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32 SECTION 2. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor
33 obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects
34 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available
35 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and
36 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and

1 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or
2 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State
3 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects
4 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds
5 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General
6 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall
7 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

8 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing
9 Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue
10 Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of this State
11 and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration,
12 as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any
13 funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law.

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15 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
16 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
17 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
18 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
19 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
20 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
21 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint
22 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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24 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
25 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
26 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
27 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2001 is essential to the operation of the
28 agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the
29 event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date
30 of this Act beyond July 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the proper
31 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an
32 emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
33 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full
34 force and effect from and after July 1, 2001.
