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2	SECTION 2. <u>EMERGENCY</u> . It is found and determined by the General		
3	Assembly that there is a substantial risk of continued failures to appear by		
4	persons served with notice to appear in municipal courts, thus weakening		
5	enforcement of the traffic and criminal laws of Arkansas and endangering		
6	travelers on Arkansas' highways. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist		
7	and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public		
8	peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by		
9	the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it		
10	shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which		
11	the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the		
12	veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house		
13	overrides the veto.
