Arkansas Code 27-14-806(b), concerning the time in which to perfect a lien on a motor vehicle, is amended to read as follows: 22 23 (b) The lien shall be deemed perfected and the constructive notice shall be effective from the date of the execution of the instrument creating 24 25 and evidencing the lien or encumbrance if it is filed as authorized in this 26 section within thirty (30) ninety (90) days after the date of the execution thereof. If the instrument is filed more than thirty (30) ninety (90) days 27 after the date of the execution thereof, the lien shall be deemed perfected 28 29 and the constructive notice shall date from the time of the filing of the instrument. However, the filing of a lien under the provisions of this 30 31 section by the lienholder and the payment of the fee therefor shall in no way 32 relieve any person of the obligation of paying the fee required by law for 33 filing a lien to be evidenced on a certificate of title of a motor vehicle. 34 35 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 27-14-807, concerning Liens upon vehicles subject to registration, is amended to add an additional subsection to read 36

as follows: (c) The failure of the transferee to timely register a vehicle on which a lien is claimed by a lienholder, based upon an instrument creating a lien duly executed by the transferee, shall not limit, restrict, or impair any claim by the lienholder to enforce the lien on the vehicle against the transferee.
