SECTION 1. (a) In accordance with the Arkansas Law Enforcement
Standards and Training Commission's certification requirements for law
enforcement officers, effective September 1, 2001, all new law enforcement
officers in the State of Arkansas shall complete at least twenty (20) hours
of training in domestic violence and twenty (20) hours of training in child
abuse. Practicumtraining will also be sufficient for this requirement.
(b) Pertaining to domestic abuse, the topics that shall be covered
are:
(1) The dynamics of domestic abuse;
(2) The Domestic Abuse Act of 1991;
(3) Domestic abuse victim interview techniques;
(4) Supportive services available; and
(5) Pro-arrest guidelines and drawbacks of dual arrest and
practices to promote the safety of officers.
(c) Pertaining to child abuse victiminterview techniques, the topics
