1 State of Arkansas A Bill 2 83rd General Assembly HOUSE BILL 2324 Regular Session, 2001 3 4 5 By: Representative Schall 6 7 For An Act To Be Entitled 8 9 AN ACT TO AMEND THE ARKANSAS GOVERNOR'S SCHOLARS PROGRAM; TO CHANGE THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS; 10 11 TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF APPLICANTS; TO LOWER THE AMOUNT OF THE AWARD; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND 12 13 FOR OTHER PURPOSES. 14 **Subtitle** 15 16 AN ACT TO AMEND THE ARKANSAS GOVERNOR'S SCHOLARS PROGRAM; TO CHANGE THE 17 ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS; TO REDUCE THE 18 19 NUMBER OF APPLICANTS; AND TO LOWER THE AMOUNT OF THE AWARD. 20 21 22 23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 24 25 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-82-301 is amended to read as follows: 26 6-82-301. Legislative determinations. The General Assembly recognizes that outstanding students are an 27 essential ingredient for the economic and social benefit of the State of 28 29 Arkansas. Benefits accrue to the state when a majority of National Merit 30 Scholars, National Achievement Scholars, and superior students attend 31 Arkansas institutions of higher learning and remain in the state. 32 33 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 6-82-302 is amended to read as follows: 6-82-302. Definitions. 34 35 As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise requires: 36 "Approved institution" means a public or private college or

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- 2 (A) Dedicated to educational purposes, located in
- 3 Arkansas, or located out of state and educating Arkansas residents in
- 4 dentistry, optometry, veterinary medicine, podiatry, chiropractic, or
- 5 osteopathy under agreement with the Board of Control for Southern Regional
- 6 Education, accredited by an accrediting agency certified and recognized by
- 7 the United States Department of Education or the Division of Agency
- 8 Evaluation and Institutional Accreditation, or a school giving satisfactory
- 9 assurance that it has the potential for accreditation and is making progress
- 10 which, if continued, will result in its achieving accreditation;
- 11 (B) Which does not discriminate in the admission of 12 students on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin; and
 - (C) Which subscribes to the principle of academic freedom;
 - (2) "Department" means the Department of Higher Education;
 - (3) "Full-time student" means a resident of Arkansas who is in attendance at an approved private or public institution and who is enrolled in at least twelve (12) semester hours credit hours the first semester and fifteen (15) hours thereafter; or other reasonable academic equivalent as defined by the department;
 - (4) "Undergraduate student" means an individual who is enrolled in a postsecondary educational program which leads to or is directly creditable toward the individual's first baccalaureate degree;
 - (5) "Eligible student" means a resident of the State of Arkansas as defined by the Department of Higher Education who is eligible for admission as a full-time student and who declares an intent to matriculate in an approved institution in Arkansas;
 - (6) "Scholarship" means an award to an eligible student for matriculation in an approved institution in the State of Arkansas;
 - (7) "Competitive examination" means a standardized examination measuring achievement which is administered annually on a specified date and at a specified location and which is announced publicly;
- 32 (8) "Academic ability" means the intellectual standing of a 33 student. In determining superior academic ability, the department shall 34 examine the student's high school records, competitive examination scores, 35 and demonstrated leadership capabilities; and
 - (9) "Extraordinary academic ability" means a score of 32 or

1	above on the American College Test (ACT), 1410 or above on the Scholastic
2	Aptitude Test (SAT), er selection as a finalist in either the National Merit
3	Scholarship competition or the National Achievement Scholarship competition
4	conducted by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.
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6	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 6-82-304 is amended to read as follows:
7	6-82-304. Administration - Authority of department.
8	The Department of Higher Education shall administer the Arkansas
9	Governor's Scholars Program and shall have the following authority and
10	responsibility with respect to the program:
11	(1) To prepare application forms or such other forms as the
12	department shall deem necessary to properly administer and carry out the
13	purposes of this subchapter;
14	(2) To establish and consult as necessary with an advisory
15	committee representing the public and private sectors of postsecondary
16	education and secondary schools in determining guidelines and regulations for
17	the administration of this program;
18	(3) To select recipients of scholarships awarded pursuant to the
19	provisions of this subchapter;
20	(4) To establish the procedures for payment of scholarships to
21	reci pi ents; and
22	(5) To set a termination date for the acceptance of
23	applications-:
24	(6) To review and evaluate the operation of the program with
25	regard to eligibility criteria and size of the scholarship award to ensure
26	that the program's operation meets the intent of this legislation; and
27	(7) To determine the necessary procedures for the awarding of
28	scholarships should the number of eligible applicants exceed the funds

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31	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 6-82-305 is amended to read as follows:
32	6-82-305. Recipients known as Arkansas Governor's Scholars or Arkansas

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4	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 6-82-306 is amended to read as follows:
5	6-82-306. Eligibility.
6	(a) The Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program scholarships are to be
7	awarded to those students who demonstrate the highest capabilities for
8	successful college study.
9	(b) A student is eligible for this scholarship if:
10	(1) The individual has met the admission requirements and is
11	accepted for enrollment as a full-time undergraduate student in an eligible
12	public or private college or university in Arkansas;
13	(2) The individual is a bona fide resident of the state, as
14	defined by the department. Preference will be given to students who plan to
15	enter college at the beginning of the academic year directly following their
16	last year of high school attendance;
17	(3) The individual is a citizen of the United States or a
18	permanent resident alien; and
19	(4)(A) The applicant has demonstrated proficiency in the
20	application of knowledge and skills in reading and writing literacy and
21	mathematics by passing the end of course examination as may be developed by
22	the Department of Education, and as may be designated by the Department of
23	<u>Higher Education for this purpose;</u>
24	(B) "End of course" examination shall mean those
25	examinations defined in § 6-15-419(4).
26	$\frac{(4)(5)(A)}{(5)(A)}$ The individual satisfactorily meets the qualifications
27	of superior academic ability as established by the department $\underline{\text{with such}}$
28	criteria consisting of value points for academic achievement and Leadership

1 authority to alter the weight assigned to the individual criterion to more 2 appropriately meet the needs of the state as determined by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board. 3 4 (c) The scholarship shall be weighed on the factors of achievement, ability, and demonstrated leadership capabilities. 5 6 (d) Students who are selected as Arkansas Governor's Scholars who also 7 exhibit extraordinary academic ability as defined in this subchapter shall be 8 designated as Arkansas Governor's Distinguished Scholars. 9 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code 6-82-311 is amended to read as follows: 10 11 6-82-311. Term, renewal, and allocation of scholarships. 12 (a) A scholarship may be awarded annually for a period not to exceed 13 an academic year. 14 (b)(1) The scholarships shall correspond to academic terms, semesters, 15 quarters, or equivalent time periods at the eligible institutions. 16 (2) In no instance may the entire amount of the grant for an 17 educational year be paid to or on behalf of students in advance. 18 (c)(1) The Provided sufficient funds are available, the scholarship 19 shall be awarded for one (1) academic year and renewed annually for three (3) 20 additional academic years if the following conditions for renewal are met: 21 (1) The student maintains not less than a 3.0 grade point 22 average on a 4.0 scholastic grading scale and meets other criteria as 23 established by the Department of Higher Education.; (2) However, effective after July 1, 1999, a A student receiving 24 25 the additional scholarship under § 6-82-312(b) must maintain maintains not 26 less than a 3.25 grade point average on a 4.0 scholastic grading scale-; 27 (3) The recipient has completed a total of at least twenty-seven (27) hours during the first full academic year and, if applicable, a total of 28 29 at least thirty (30) hours per academic year thereafter; 30 (4) If the student is entering the junior year, the student has 31 taken the standardized rising junior test provided for in § 6-61-114; and 32 (5) The recipient has met any other continuing eligibility 33 criteria established by the Department of Higher Education.

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35 SECTION 7. Arkansas Code 6-82-312 is amended to read as follows: 36 6-82-312. Scholarship amounts.

- (a) Scholarships awarded to new recipients who enroll in college as first-time entering freshmen after July 1, 1995, shall be in the amount of four thousand dollars (\$4,000) per year, provided funds are available.
- (b) Students Provided sufficient funds are available, students who are were first-time entering freshmen after July 1, 1997 but before July 1, 2001, and who exhibit exhibited extraordinary academic achievement shall be awarded, in addition to the award in subsection (a) of this section, an amount per year which when combined with the award in subsection (a) of this section equals tuition, room and board, required textbooks, and mandatory fees charged for a regular full-time course load by the approved institution in which the recipient is enrolled.
- (c) Provided sufficient funds are available, students who are first-time entering freshmen after July 1, 2001, and who exhibit extraordinary academic achievement shall be awarded, in addition to the award in subsection (a) of this section, an amount per year which, when combined with the award in subsection (a) of this section, equals the lesser of:
 - (1) Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or
- (2) Tuition, room and board, required textbooks, and mandatory fees charged for a regular full-time course load by the approved institution in which the recipient is enrolled.

SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly that the state does not have the funds to support the Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program in its current form; and that applicants graduating after December 31, 2000, will experience uncertainty regarding eligibility for the Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program; and that many applicants may be delayed in beginning their post-secondary education unless changes in the scholarship program become effective in sufficient time to allow scholarship awards to be made to those students needing to make enrollment decisions for the 2001-2002 academic year. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on March 1, 2001.
