25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
26

27 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-17-106(a), pertaining to insult or abuse of
28 a teacher, is amended to read as follows:

29 (a) ~~(1) Any person who shall abuse or insult a public school teacher~~
30 ~~while that teacher is performing normal and regular or assigned school~~
31 ~~responsibilities~~ It is unlawful, during regular school hours, and in a place
32 where a public school employee is required to be in the course of his or her
33 duties, for any person to address a public school employee using language
34 which, in its common acceptance, is calculated to:

35 (A) Cause a breach of the peace;

36 (B) Materially and substantially interfere with the

1 operation of the school; or
2 (C) Arouse the person to whom it is addressed to anger, to
3 the extent likely to cause imminent retaliation.

4 (2) A person who violates this section shall be guilty of a
5 misdemeanor and upon conviction be liable for a fine of not less than one
6 hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than one thousand five hundred dollars
7 (\$1,500).
