Stricken language would be deleted from and underlined language would be added to the law as it existed prior to this session of the General Assembly.

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-17-106(a), pertaining to insult or abuse of a teacher, is amended to read as follows:
(a) (1) Any person who shall abuse or insult a public school teacher while that teacher is performing normal and regular or assigned school pesponsibilities It is unlawful, during regular school hours, and in a place where a public school employee is required to be in the course of his or her duties, for any person to address a public school employee using language which, in its common acceptation, is calculated to:
(A) Cause a breach of the peace;
(B) Materially and substantially interfere with the

operation of the school: or
    (C) Arouse the person to whom it i s addressed to anger, to
the extent likely to cause imminent retali ation.
    (2) A person who violates this section shall be guilty of a
mi sdemeanor and upon conviction be liable for a fine of not less than one
hundred dollars ($100) nor more than one thousand five hundred dollars
($1,500).
