18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

20 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 5-60-120(a) is amended to read as follows:

21 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person to intercept a wire, oral, or
22 telephonic communication, ~~defined as~~ or wireless communication including
23 communications that utilize ~~the electromagnetic spectrum frequencies of~~
24 ~~forty six to forty nine megahertz (46-49 mghz.)~~ generally used by cordless
25 telephone technology and ~~eight hundred forty to eight hundred eighty~~
26 ~~megahertz (840-880 mghz.)~~ generally used by cellular telephone technology,
27 and to record or possess a recording of such communication unless such a
28 person is a party to the communication or one (1) of the parties to the
29 communication has given prior consent to such interception and recording.
