21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 27-37-306, concerning light transmission
24 levels for tinting of motor vehicle windows, is amended to add an additional
25 subsection as follows:

26 (j)(1) Driver, passenger, and rear windows of primary vehicles used by
27 private investigators may be tinted to the extent that the tint permits at
28 least ten percent (10%) net light transmission.

29 (2) To qualify as a primary vehicle used by a private
30 investigator, that vehicles must be used at least ninety percent (90%) of the
31 time for surveillance as verified by a mileage log.

32 (3) Private investigators shall annually purchase a window tint
33 permit for twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) from the Arkansas State Police.

34 (4) If stopped by a law enforcement officer, the private
35 investigator shall roll down both passenger and driver side windows of the
36 vehicle, and during hours of darkness, turn on the vehicle's interior lights.

1 (5) Private investigators shall carry the tint permit and the
2 private investigator's license required by § 17-40-305, in the vehicle at all
3 times.

4 (6) Violation of this subsection (j) is a Class C misdemeanor.
