3	(e) For purposes of this section, "torture" means to inflict any			
4	unnecessary and unjustifiable severe pain or unnecessary and unjustifiable			
5	serious injury on a dog, cat, or horse.			
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7	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General			
8	Assembly that each year there is an increasing number of dogs, cats and			
9	horses subjected to cruel treatment and needless suffering, and the present			
10	law concerning cruelty to animals needs more specificity with regard to those			
11	acts against animals which subject persons to criminal responsibility.			
12	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately			
13	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall			
14	become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is			
15	neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the			
16	expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill.			
17	If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall			
18	become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.			
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
