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29	That the House Interim Committee on Agriculture and Economic

33	(1) Standard Letter of Clearance. Determine what requirements are or

requirements of the United States Department of Agriculture, present standards required by the Arkansas State Plant Board and all other matters deemed appropriate;

- (2) Termite Policies. Determine whether a one-year policy should be required in order for issuance of a Standard Letter of Clearance, or whether the expense thereof should be at the option of persons requesting the Standard Letter of Clearance or other certificate providing that real property and improvements thereon are free of termite (or other pest) infestation and termite (or other pest) damage;
- (3) Treatment Methods. Determine past, present and future methods of treating real property and improvements thereon to prevent termite and other pest infestation and damage, in order for the Arkansas General Assembly to determine whether legislation should be considered regarding regulation of minimum treatment methods to be performed by pest control and termite control companies in this state in order to protect the owners of real property and improvements thereon in this *state*.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committees complete their study no later than September 1, 2002.
