ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE SENATE, A MAJ ORITY OF ALL
MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:
That the following is hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state for approval or rejection at the next general election for Representatives and Senators, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at such election, adopt such amendment, the same shall become a part of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas, to wit:
SECTION 1. Section 2 of Amendment 73 to the Constitution of Arkansas is amended to read as follows:
§2. Legislative Branch.
(a) Effective with the 2002 election, the The Arkans House of Representatives shall consist of members to be chosen every second year by the qualified electors of the several counties. No member of the arkansas House of Representatives may serve more than three such two year terms twelve

(b) (1) Effective with the 2002 election, the The Arkansas Senate shall consist of members to be chosen every four years by the qualified electors of the several districts. No member of the Arkansas Senate may serve more than
two such four year terms twelve (12) years.
(2)(A) If a member of the Arkansas Senate serves one (1) and
only one (1) two-year term as a result of reapportionment and the senator's
Iast term is four (4) years, the senator shall only serve two (2) years of
the four-year term.
(B) The successor to the senator shall serve the remainder
of the four-year term.
(c) Members of the House of Representatives and Senate elected prior
to the year 2002 shall only be allowed to serve three (3) two-year terms and
two (2) four-year terms in their respective house.
