1 (2) Payments shall be made in equal monthly installments. 2 (b)(1) In the event a member has not completed payment of his service 3 contributions as provided for in § 24-5-108(b) and is current in his or her 4 service contributions at the time of retirement, the Board of Trustees of the 5 Arkansas State Highway Employees' Retirement System is authorized to deduct 6 from each monthly annuity payment an amount equal to one-twelfth (1/12) of the 7 unpaid balance of such service contributions. 8 (2) The deductions shall continue until all service contributions 9 have been paid in full. 10 SECTION 2.
