Arkansas Code 10-3-301(a)(1), relating to the selection of 28 29 Senate members of the Legislative Council, is amended to read as follows: (1)(A) The Senate of the General Assembly shall select sometime before 30 31 adjournment of each regular session twelve (12) members, with three (3) members to be chosen from each of the four (4) congressional districts of the 32 33 state in effect on January 1, 1987, by caucus of the members of the Senate residing in their respective congressional districts. 34 (B) Provided, however, after January 1, 1999, the twelve (12) 35 36 members selected by the Senate shall be selected sixteen (16) members in

accordance with procedures prescribed by Senate Rules;
