Arkansas Code 27-14-2401 is repealed. 23 27-14-2401. Temporary permit for inoperable vehicles or vehicles under 24 25 repair. 26 (a)(1) If at the time of vehicle registration renewal, a motor vehicle 27 or trailer has been inoperable or is in the course of undergoing some type of a vehicle repair which makes it impossible for it to undergo a vehicle safety 28 29 inspection in time for the timely renewal of its vehicle registration, then the owner may apply at the nearest state revenue office for a three-day 30 31 exemption permit to allow it to be operated on the highways without a current motor vehicle safety inspection and without a current license plate and 32 33 registration decals' being attached. 34 (2) The three-day exemption permit shall be issued only for the purpose of authorizing motor vehicles to be operated while under repair and in 35 36 transit from the place of the vehicle's repair to a vehicle safety inspection

1	station or from the vehicle safety inspection station to the point of vehicle
2	regi strati on.
3	(b)(1) Before the nearest state revenue office may issue a three-day
4	exemption permit under this section, a person shall file an affidavit stating
5	that his or her motor vehicle or trailer has been inoperable or is undergoing
6	some type of a vehicle repair which makes it impossible for it to undergo a
7	vehicle safety inspection in time for the timely renewal of his or her vehicle
8	registration and that his or her motor vehicle or trailer needs an exemption
9	permit in order to be operated while under repair and in transit from the
10	place of the vehicle's repair to a vehicle safety inspection station or from
11	the vehicle safety inspection station to the point of vehicle registration.
12	(2) If the affidavit be false, the making of the affidavit shall
13	constitute a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not less than
14	two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500).
15	(c)(1) The three day exemption permit issued under the provisions of
16	this section shall permit motor vehicles and trailers which are undergoing
17	repairs to be operated without a current vehicle registration or a vehicle
18	safety inspection on the public streets and highways of this state for a
19	period not exceeding three (3) calendar days.
20	(2)(A) In the event that the vehicle repairs were not successful
21	or that the vehicle failed inspection, another permit may be issued one (1)
22	time for an additional three (3) days.
23	(B) Provided, however, no more than two (2) permits issued
24	under this subchapter may be issued to any single motor vehicle or trailer
25	during any twelve month period.
26	(d) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration is
27	authorized to promulgate rules and regulations as he deems necessary for the
28	proper implementation of this subchapter, including the promulgation of a
29	uniform affidavit form to be used in each state revenue office.
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
