9 AN ACT TO REAPPROPRIATE THE BALANCES OF CAPITAL
10 IMPROVEMENT APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE SECRETARY OF STATE;

14 AN ACT FOR THE SECRETARY OF STATE
15 REAPPROPRIATION.
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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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21 SECTION 1. REAPPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the Secretary
22 of State, to be payable from the General Improvement Fund or its successor
23 fund or fund accounts, for the Secretary of State, the following:

24 (A) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
25 Item (F) of Section 1 of Act 165 of 1999, for Phase III of the HVAC project
26 for the State Capitol Building, in a sum not to exceed \$736,034.

27 (B) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
28 Item (G) of Section 1 of Act 165 of 1999, for upgrading the State Capitol
29 Building exterior lighting to eliminate deteriorated components and to bring
30 lighting into compliance with electrical codes, in a sum not to exceed
31 \$27,500.

32 (C) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
33 Item (H) of Section 1 of Act 165 of 1999, for purchase and installation of an
34 enhanced communication system for the State Capitol Police, in a sum not to
35 exceed \$40,419.

36 (D) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in

1 Item (I) of Section 1 of Act 165 of 1999, for replacing, repairing, and
2 upgrading the electrical system in the State Capitol Building, in a sum not to
3 exceed\$2,500,000.

4 (E) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
5 Item (K) of Section 1 of Act 165 of 1999, for pipe lining and replacement of
6 roof drain pipes and structural work and interior finishes to correct water
7 damage, in a sum not to exceed\$38,353.

8 (F) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
9 Item (L) of Section 1 of Act 165 of 1999, for lightning protection for the
10 Capitol, Capitol Hill Building and the Boiler Building (Grounds Maintenance
11 Shop), in a sum not to exceed\$75,000.

12 (G) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
13 Item (M) of Section 1 of Act 165 of 1999, for entry landing repairs to the
14 north, south and west entries, in a sum not to exceed\$50,149.

15 (H) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
16 Item (N) of Section 1 of Act 165 of 1999, for repair of Confederate Monument
17 bases, in a sum not to exceed\$8,000.

18 (I) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
19 Item (O) of Section 1 of Act 165 of 1999, for emergency repairs for unexpected
20 problems or catastrophes that might occur at the Capitol, the Capitol Hill
21 Building, and the Boiler Room which might include equipment failures, storm
22 damage, water and sewer pipe failure, in a sum not to exceed\$9,697.

23 (J) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
24 Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for the installation of a fire alarm
25 system in the State Capitol Building, in a sum not to exceed\$106,798.

26 (K) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
27 Item (B) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for restoration of the Governor's
28 Conference Room, including upgrading of the mechanical and electrical systems,
29 in a sum not to exceed\$100,000.

30 (L) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
31 Item (C) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for restoration of the Supreme Court
32 Chamber in the State Capitol Building, including upgrading the mechanical and
33 electrical systems, in a sum not to exceed\$232,992.

34 (M) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
35 Item (D) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for repairing and restoring the
36 chandelier in the Capitol rotunda, providing cove lighting, and updating

1 wiring and electrical devices, in a sum not to exceed\$150,000.

2 (N) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
3 Item (E) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for analysis of the State Capitol
4 Building interior and exterior stone to prepare for cleaning and repair, in a
5 sum not to exceed\$32,000.

6 (O) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
7 Item (F) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for Phase IV of the Heating,
8 Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) project for the State Capitol
9 Building, in a sum not to exceed\$2,500,000.

10 (P) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
11 Item (G) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for major building and grounds
12 repairs/replacements to include replacement of irrigation main lines, roof
13 repairs, repointing and repair of porticos, in a sum not to exceed ..\$838,422.

14 (Q) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
15 Item (H) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for replacing, repairing and
16 upgrading the electrical system in the State Capitol Building, in a sum not to
17 exceed\$2,500,000.

18 (R) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
19 Item (I) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for replacement of the State Capitol
20 Building Sewer Line and connection to the City Sewer Line, in a sum not to
21 exceed\$2,100,000.

22 (S) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
23 Item (J) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for prevention and repair of State
24 Capitol Building water leaks, in a sum not to exceed\$1,000,000.

25 (T) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
26 Item (K) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for Phase II of the renovation of
27 the State Capitol Building cafeteria, in a sum not to exceed\$200,000.

28 (U) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
29 Item (L) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for completion of the State Capitol
30 Building lightning protection project, in a sum not to exceed\$50,000.

31 (V) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
32 Item (M) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for refurbishing the dome/ceiling
33 area of the Senate and House chambers, in a sum not to exceed\$125,000.

34 (W) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
35 Item (N) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for upgrading the electrical and
36 plumbing systems at the Capitol Hill Building, in a sum not to exceed

1 \$2, 600, 000.

2 (X) Effective July 1, 2001, the balance of the appropriation provided in
3 Item (0) of Section 1 of Act 563 of 1999, for the repair of the North
4 Bicentennial Fountain and the addition of a new fountain between Woodlane and
5 the main Capitol steps, in a sum not to exceed \$225, 000.

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7 SECTION 2. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor
8 obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects
9 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available
10 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and
11 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and
12 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or
13 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State
14 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects
15 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds
16 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General
17 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall
18 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

19 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing
20 Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue
21 Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of this State
22 and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration,
23 as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any
24 funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law.

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26 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
27 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
28 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
29 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
30 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
31 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
32 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint
33 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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35 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
36 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the

1 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that previous
2 General Assemblies have provided appropriations for the projects provided or
3 enumerated in this act; that certain appropriations will expire before the
4 adjournment of the General Assembly; and that if such appropriations expire,
5 the projects and programs authorized herein will cease thereby depriving the
6 citizens of the State of the benefits to be derived from such projects.
7 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
8 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
9 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its
10 passage and approval. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the
11 Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time
12 during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the
13 Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the
14 last house overrides the veto.

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
