Arkansas Code 14-43-316 is amended to read as follows: 23 14-43-316. City clerk, treasurer, or clerk-treasurer in mayor-council 24 cities of less than 50,000. 25 (a) The qualified voters of cities of the first class having a 26 population of less than fifty thousand (50,000) and having the mayor-council 27 form of government shall elect one (1) city clerk, one (1) treasurer, unless appointed pursuant to § 14-43-405 or a clerk-treasurer on the first Tuesday 28 following the first Monday in November, 1962, and every four (4) years 29 thereafter. The city clerk, treasurer or clerk-treasurer shall hold office for 30 31 four (4) years and until his successor is elected and qualified. 32 (b) The clerk, treasurer or clerk-treasurer shall take his the oath of 33 office with the other city officials that are elected in the general election in 1962 and in that manner every four (4) years thereafter. 34 35 (c) The clerk, treasurer or clerk-treasurer shall give the bond and perform the duties as are prescribed by law and shall receive such salary as 36

1	prescribed by ordinance in each of these cities.
2	(d) The incumbent in any city having this population shall continue to
3	be the clerk, treasurer or clerk-treasurer and receive such salary and perform
4	such duties until <u>his a</u> successor is elected and qualified.
5	
6	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 14-43-405 is amended to read as follows:
7	14-43-405. Treasurer - Clerk-treasurer in mayor-council cities.
8	All cities of the first class having the mayor-council form of
9	government may provide, by ordinance, for the election or appointment of their
10	city treasurer. The city council may, by ordinance or resolution, designate
11	the city clerk as clerk-treasurer, allowing one (1) person to assume the
12	duties of both clerk and treasurer. The term of office for these positions
13	combined or separate is four (4) years.
14	
15	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 14-44-115 is amended to read as follows:
16	14-44-115. Election of recorder, treasurer or recorder-treasurer.
17	The qualified voters of cities of the second class shall, on the Tuesday
18	following the first Monday in November 1972, and every four (4) years
19	thereafter, elect a recorder, a treasurer, or a recorder-treasurer, as the
20	case may be, for a term of four (4) years.
