1 (3) Proper treatment of individuals living with HIV/AIDS who are 2 pregnant can significantly decrease the possibility of infecting their unborn 3 chi I dren; (4) Infection rates among Arkansas citizens can be curtailed by the 4 5 proper administration of drug therapies to those infected with HIV/AIDS; 6 (5) The continued medical costs associated with HIV related illnesses 7 are a threat to the medical infrastructure of Arkansas; 8 (6) The quality of life of those individuals affected by HIV/AIDS, along 9 with their family members, can be enhanced through continuing drug therapies; 10 (7) There is a pressing and immediate need for the distribution of 11 medications for HIV/AIDS; and (8) This act can help meet these needs by furnishing financial 12 13 assistance, subject to the availability of funds, to citizens of Arkansas suffering from HIV/AIDS. 14 15 16 SECTION 3. IMPLEMENTATION. The State Board of Health shall promulgate regulations to provide for 17 the distribution of HIV/AIDS medications to Arkansas citizens without ample 18 19 resources or available avenues to acquire their medically necessary 20 medications. 21 22 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Eighty-third General Assembly that there is a pressing and immediate need for 23 the distribution of medications for HIV/AIDS to alleviate suffering, to 24 25 protect pregnant women with HIV/AIDS and their unborn children and to prevent 26 severe damage to the medical infrastructure of Arkansas. Therefore, an 27 emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective 28 29 on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved 30 nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the 31 period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is 32 vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective 33 on the date the last house overrides the veto. /s/ B. Walker 34
