EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General

- 17 by the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee as soon as it organizes after the
- 18 *adjournment of this regular session; and that unless this act goes into effect*
- 19 *immediately, the Committee will not be able to select its co-chairpersons*
- 20 <u>until perhaps months after its initial meeting</u>. Therefore, an emergency is
- 21 <u>declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the</u>
- 22 preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on

23 the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor

- 24 <u>vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the</u>
- 25 period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is
- 26 <u>vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective</u>
