Arkansas Code 25-19-105(b), concerning exceptions to the 19 Freedom of Information Act, is amended to read as follows: (b) It is the specific intent of this section that the following shall 20 21 not be deemed to be made open to the public under the provisions of this 22 chapter: (1) State income tax records; 23 (2) Medical records, scholastic records, and adoption records; 24 25 (3) The site files and records maintained by the Arkansas 26 Historic Preservation Program and the Arkansas Archeological Survey; 27 (4) Grand jury minutes; (5) Unpublished drafts of judicial or quasijudicial opinions and 28 deci si ons; 29 (6) Undisclosed investigations by law enforcement agencies of 30 31 suspected criminal activity; (7) Unpublished memoranda, working papers, and correspondence of 32 33 the Governor, members of the General Assembly, Supreme Court Justices, Court of Appeals Judges, and the Attorney General; 34 35 Documents which are protected from disclosure by order or 36 rule of court;

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1	(9)(A) Files which, if disclosed, would give advantage to
2	competitors or bidders; and
3	(B)(i) Records For one (1) year after a contract between
4	the Arkansas Economic Development Commission and a business entity receiving
5	assistance from the commission has been signed, records maintained by the
6	Arkansas Economic Development Commission related to any business entity's
7	planning, site location, expansion, operations, or product development and
8	marketing, unless approval for release of such records is granted by the
9	business entity.
10	(ii) Provided, however, this exemption shall not be
11	applicable to any records of expenditures or grants made or administered by
12	the Arkansas Economic Development Commission and otherwise disclosable under
13	the provisions of this chapter;
14	(10) Personnel records to the extent that disclosure would
15	constitute clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy; and
16	(11)(A) The identities of law enforcement officers currently
17	working undercover with their agencies and identified in the Arkansas Minimum
18	Standards Office as undercover officers.
19	(B) Records of the number of undercover officers and
20	agency lists are not exempt from this chapter.
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
