19 SECTION 6. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED 20 SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES. (A) For all 21 appropriations as provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall monitor the level of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly 22 23 basis. If any proposed expenditures would cause a fund balance to decline to 24 less than fifty percent (50%) of the balance available on July 1, 2001, the 25 disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive head of the agency. 26 Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the agency 27 head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 28 State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall 29 provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall 30 include the following: 31 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such 32 expenditures on the fund balance. 33 2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut or 34 any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance. 35 3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs 36 or one-time purchase of capitalized items.

<u>4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not</u>
<u>jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent</u>
<u>depletion of the fund balance.</u>
<u>(B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and</u>
<u>approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought</u>
<u>prior review by the Legislative Council.</u>

8 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by 9 this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made 10 available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions 11 of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures 12 Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and 13 Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their 14 successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and 15 regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as 16 authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said 17 funds.

19 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 20 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 21 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 22 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 23 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 24 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 25 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint 26 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 28 29 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 30 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 31 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2001 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the 32 33 event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the proper 34 35 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an 36 emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
