## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE OUACHITA TECHNICAL COLLEGE FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 2003; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

AN ACT FOR THE OUACHITA TECHNICAL COLLEGE APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2001-2003 BI ENNI UM.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for the Ouachita Technical College for the 2001-2003 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for the Ouachita Technical College for the 2001-2003 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: sixty (60)
temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Cl assification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Ouachita Technical College, to be payable from the Ouachita Technical College Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the Ouachita Technical College for the biennial period ending June 30, 2003, the following:

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Ouachita Technical College, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Ouachita Technical College, for personal services and operating expenses of the Ouachita Technical College for the biennial period ending June 30, 2003, the following:

SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE I NCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLI SHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PRIORITIES. A high priority of the Ouachita Technical College shall be to combat illiteracy and to provide industrial training in the work place.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only fromluly 1,2001 through June 30, 2003.

SECTION 6. NOT TO BE I NCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED

SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES. (A) For all appropriations as provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall monitor the level of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly basis. If any proposed expenditures would cause a fund balance to decline to less than fifty percent ( $50 \%$ of the balance available on July 1,2001 , the disbursing officer shall i mmediately notify the executive head of the agency. Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the agency head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal officer of the State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall include the following:

1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such expenditures on the fund balance.
2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut or any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund bal ance.
3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
or one-time purchase of capitalized items.
4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not
Lepardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
depletion of the fund bal ance.
(B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought
prior review by the Legislative Council.

SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the of ficial minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on لuly 1, 2001 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2001.
