9 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR BREAST CANCER  
10 RESEARCH PROGRAM EXPENSES FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF  
11 ARKANSAS FOR MEDICAL SCIENCES WHICH SHALL BE  
12 SUPPLEMENTAL AND IN ADDITION TO THOSE FUNDS  
13 APPROPRIATED BY ACT 1398 OF 1999; AND FOR OTHER  
14 PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

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18 AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS  
19 FOR MEDICAL SCIENCES - BREAST CANCER  
20 RESEARCH PROGRAM EXPENSES SUPPLEMENTAL  
21 APPROPRIATION.  
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24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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26 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - BREAST CANCER RESEARCH PROGRAM EXPENSES. There  
27 is hereby appropriated, to the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, to  
28 be payable from the Breast Cancer Research Fund, for allocation to the Breast  
29 Cancer Research Program for the awarding of grants, chairs and contracts to  
30 researchers for research with respect to the cause, cure, treatment,  
31 prevention and earlier detection of breast cancer and for developing  
32 leadership in research in Arkansas, as may be authorized by law, by the  
33 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences which shall be supplemental and in  
34 addition to those funds appropriated in Section 10 of Act 1398 of 1999, the

6 SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by

7 this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made

8 available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions

9 of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures

10 Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and

11 Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their

12 successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and

13 regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as

14 authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said

15 funds.

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17 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly

18 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained

19 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act

20 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations

21 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by

22 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral

23 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint

24 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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26 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General

27 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of

28 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences are, due to unforeseen

29 circumstances, insufficient for the University of Arkansas for Medical

30 Sciences to continue to provide essential governmental services; that the

31 provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies for the University of

32 Arkansas for Medical Sciences to continue such services; and that a delay in

33 the effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper

34 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an

35 emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the

36 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full

1 force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

2   If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become  
3 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor  
4 may veto the bill.  If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is  
5 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the  
6 veto.

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
