## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 19-11-222 RELATING TO  
10 THE JURISDICTION OF THE STATE PROCUREMENT DIRECTOR;  
11 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

### Subtitle

13 AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 19-11-222  
14 RELATING TO THE JURISDICTION OF THE  
15 STATE PROCUREMENT DIRECTOR.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
20

21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 19-11-222 is amended to read as follows:  
22 19-11-222. Exclusive jurisdiction over procurement.

23 (a) The State ~~Purchasing~~ Procurement Director shall have exclusive  
24 jurisdiction over the procurement of the following commodities and services:  
25

- 26 (1) Items subject to Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 54;
- 27 (2) Wholesale gasoline, oil, antifreeze, and related products;
- 28 (3) Tires;
- 29 (4) Tubes;
- 30 (5) Passenger motor vehicles and trucks, except highway  
31 construction and highway maintenance equipment or any specialized type of  
32 equipment used in highway construction except as otherwise provided in this  
33 subchapter;
- 34 (6) Paper products; ~~and~~
- 35 (7) New and used school buses for state agencies and school  
36 districts; and

1           (8) A purchasing card program to include implementation and  
2 administration.

3           (b) For purposes of this section:

4           (1) "Printing" means the process of transferring images, by the  
5 use of standard industrial type printer ink, upon documents such as  
6 letterhead, envelopes, pamphlets, booklets, and forms;

7           (2) "Stationery" means imprinted letterhead and envelopes used  
8 by the General Assembly and other departments of state government to identify  
9 an individual department, agency, board, commission, etc; and

10           (3) "Supplies" means paper and inks used to produce stationery.

11  
12           SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
13 General Assembly that this measure is necessary to clarify the state's  
14 purchasing law and to prevent disruptions in the orderly conduct of business  
15 by agencies of the state. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and  
16 this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public  
17 peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval  
18 by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,  
19 it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during  
20 which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor  
21 and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last  
22 house overrides the veto.
