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(c) The division shall be a central assistance and information resource for all museums and museum personnel in Arkansas.

- 13-5-204. Division director Duties.
- (a) The Arkansas Museum Services Division shall be headed by a director to be appointed by the Director of the Department of Parks and Tourism.
- (b) The division director shall develop and administer all Arkansas Museum Services Division programs, monitor the grants-in-aid, and act in advisory and consulting capacity to the Director of the Department of Parks and Tourism.
- (c) The division director shall determine the needs of museums and related programs and provide and establish those services deemed necessary, beneficial, and appropriate. He shall do any and all other acts or things deemed necessary or appropriate to foster and promote development of museums and related programs in Arkansas.

13-5-205. Acceptance of grants, donations, etc.

The Arkansas Museum Services Division within the Department of Parks and Tourism shall be an official agency authorized to accept and receive any grants, moneys, equipment, materials and services, real and personal property donated or bequeathed or devised for any purpose relating to the development of museums, related programs, and the heritage of Arkansas and not expressly designated for some other state agency and to disburse and utilize such gifts for the purposes of this subchapter.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 13-5-206 is amended to read as follows: 13-5-206. Program of grants-in-aid and technical assistance.

The Arkansas Museum Services Division State Parks Division of the Department of Parks and Tourism shall establish and carry out a program of grants-in-aid to eligible museums or, in appropriate cases, organizations engaged in or concerned with history, science, art, or culture, on the basis of fifty percent (50%) state grant funds and fifty percent (50%) of the funds to be provided by the museum, as follows:

(1) Only museums and programs concerned with historical, scientific, cultural, or artistically oriented programs offering nonprofit services to the general public may make application for and qualify for funds under this

1 subchapter;

- (2) None of the funds received by a museum or other organization which qualifies or utilizes funds under this subchapter shall be used as matching funds for other state funds; and
- (3) All requests for state grant funds under this subchapter shall be prepared on forms promulgated or approved by the division and shall be in compliance with the provisions of this subchapter and with reasonable rules and regulations to be promulgated by the division for the administration of this subchapter.
- (4) The division shall provide technical assistance and information to all museums and museum personnel in Arkansas, within the limitations of available staff and funding.

- SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 13-5-207 is amended to read as follows:
- 15 13-5-207. Arkansas Museum Services Review Panel.
 - (a)(1) The Governor of the State of Arkansas shall establish an Arkansas Museum Services Review Panel to consist of five (5) members, one (1) member from each congressional district and one (1) member designated at large.
 - (2) The members shall serve two-year terms.
 - (b) The sole purpose and authority of the panel is to analyze, review, and approve the qualifications of the applications and to present recommendations to the Director of the Arkansas Museum Services State Parks

 Division for the awarding of grants to eligible museums on a yearly basis with the final approval of the Director of the Department of Parks and Tourism.
 - (c) The panel shall serve without pay. However, the division is authorized to reimburse the members of the panel for expenses in accordance with § 25-16-901 et seq.

- SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 13-5-401 is amended to read as follows:
- 31 13-5-401. Museum established.

The Arkansas Museum Services State Parks Division of the Department of Parks and Tourism is authorized and directed to establish a state historical museum in Union County, to be known and operated as the "Arkansas Museum of Natural Resources".

- 1 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 13-5-402 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 13-5-402. Functions and duties.
 - (a) The Arkansas Museum of Natural Resources shall be developed and operated by the Arkansas Museum Services State Parks Division of the Department of Parks and Tourism and shall be devoted primarily to the acquisition, cataloging, and display of machinery, equipment, and materials used in the oil boom in Arkansas.
 - (b) In addition, the Arkansas Museum of Natural Resources shall solicit, purchase, or accept donations of maps, core drilling samples, and other records of geological or historical value, to be made available to the public as a source of historical information concerning the geology and technology of the oil industry in this state.

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- SECTION 6. Arkansas Code 13-5-403 is amended to read as follows:
- 15 13-5-403. Museum site.

The Arkansas Museum of Natural Resources shall be established at a site to be approved by the Arkansas Museum Services State Parks Division, with the lands therefor, which shall consist of not less than five (5) acres, to be donated without cost to the State of Arkansas.

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- SECTION 7. Arkansas Code 13-5-404 is amended to read as follows:
- 22 13-5-404. Arkansas Museum of Natural Resources Advisory Committee.
 - (a) The Governor shall establish an Arkansas Museum of Natural Resources Advisory Committee, to consist of fifteen (15) members, appointed by the Governor, who shall serve in an advisory capacity to the Arkansas Museum Services State Parks Division and the Director of the Department of Parks and Tourism.
 - (b)(1) At least half of the members shall be residents of oil or brine-producing counties of South Arkansas.
 - (2) All members shall be appointed for terms of five (5) years.
