33	SECTION 2. Emergency clause. It is hereby found and determined by the	ì
34	Eighty-third General Assembly that this act should go into effect as soon as	
35	possible in order to bring the Arkansas Employment Security Law into	
36	<u>conformity with the Federal Unemployment Tax Act, as amended, so that</u>	

1	Arkansas employers may continue to receive the tax credits accorded by the
2	Federal Unemployment Tax Act and the Arkansas workers may receive
3	<u>unemployment benefits when they are unemployed. Therefore, an emergency is</u>
4	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
5	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on
6	the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved
7	nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of
8	the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill
9	is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become
10	effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
