10	SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE

12	TRANSFER. When funds are authorized to be made available through the		
13	provisions of the General Improvement Distribution Act of 2001 to match

16	Fiscal Officer of the State and State Treasurer shall transfer the sum of

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1 and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, 2 as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any 3 funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law. 4 5 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 6 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 7 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 8 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 9 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 10 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 11 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint 12 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 13 14 SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 15 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 16 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 17 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2001 is essential to the operation of the 18 agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the 19 event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date 20 of this Act beyond July 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the proper 21 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an 22 emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the 23 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2001. 24 25 /s/ Joint Budget Committee 26 27 28 29 30 31
