24 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. YOUTH 26 SERVICES - COMMUNITY-BASED RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS - RESTRICTIONS. 27 Department of Human Services shall not contract or pay for community-based residential programs within any municipality to house unrelated persons who 28 29 have been adjudicated delinquent of an act that would constitute a Class A felony or higher or of a sexual offense or convicted of a Class A felony or 30 higher or sexual offense until the following conditions have been met:

- 31
- 32 1. Residents within one thousand (1,000) feet of the proposed location of the 33
- facility shall be notified by mail;
- 2. A public hearing shall be conducted in the community of the proposed 34
- 35 location of the facility by the contract provider at least ten (10) days in
- advance of the contract's effective date. Notice of the hearing shall be 36

made by mail to each of the residents within 1,000 feet of the proposed location of the facility. The notification requirement shall not apply to already existing facilities at already existing locations.

Provided further, upon establishment of such facilities within a particular municipality, the contract provider and the Department shall establish and implement a system to receive and respond to complaints and questions from residents of such municipality. In the event the Department and the provider fail to provide satisfactory communication as provided in this section to the residents, such facility may be declared a public nuisance by the municipality.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2003.

SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. YOUTH SERVICES - COMMUNITY BASED PROGRAM ALLOCATIONS. The Division of Youth Services (DYS) shall continue to allocate at least the current allocation of \$13,904,627 of state general revenue funding and appropriation which is currently provided through the Youth Services - Community Services appropriation. The DYS shall not use federal funds received due to recent DYS' efforts to maximize federal funding to supplant the current general revenue commitment to the comprehensive community based contracts. Further, 80% of the federal reimbursement received for Targeted Case Management services provided by community-based providers shall be placed in community-based contracts utilizing the established funding formula. The remaining 20% of the new federal funding shall be retained by DYS for the purpose of paying for administrative and other costs of operations at the DYS state agency level.

Each community based provider shall use the new funding which is received due to this new initiative to increase current services, provide new services in the community, and support administrative and other costs of operations at the community level as directed by the Division of Youth Services.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001

1 through June 30, 2003. 2 3 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER OF FUNDS FOR THE JUVENILE OMBUDSMAN PROGRAM. The Department of Human 5 Services shall provide funding in an amount not to exceed \$300,000 for each 6 7 fiscal year of the biennial period ending June 30, 2003 for the Juvenile 8 Ombudsman Program described in ACA 16-87-216. Upon request by the Executive 9 Director of the Arkansas Public Defender Commission, the Chief Fiscal Officer 10 of the State shall transfer an amount not to exceed \$300,000 for each year of 11 the biennial period ending June 30, 2003 from an account designated by the Director of the Department of Human Services to the State Central Services 12 13 Fund as a direct revenue to fund the Juvenile Ombudsman Program. 14 15 SECTI ON 12. The Chief Fiscal Officer 18 of the State shall transfer funds in an amount of \$400,000 for each fiscal year of the biennial period ending June 30, 2003 from the Department of Human 19 20 Services - Youth Services Fund Account to the Juvenile Detention Facilities 21 Operating Fund to fund the appropriation to the Department of Finance and 22 Administration - Disbursing Officer for grants for operating expenses of 23 local juvenile detention facilities. 24 25 The amount of the funds transferred in each fiscal year of the biennial 26 period ended June 30, 2003 may be adjusted upon request of the Director of 27 the Department of Human Services on a pro-rata basis with any reductions 28 provided in the Revenue Stabilization Law from the July 1 Official Forecast of general revenue funding for the Division of Youth Services. 29 30 31 SECTION 13.
