Arkansas Code 17-40-102 is amended to read as follows: 21 22 17-40-102. Definitions. 23 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires: (1) "Accident reconstruction" means the interpretation of physical 24 25 evidence in the application of scientific principles to form opinions 26 relative to the events of an accident; 27 (2) "Administrator" means the administrator of the Arkansas Board of Private Investigators and Private Security Agencies; 28 29 (3) "Alarm systems agent" means any individual employed by an alarm systems company who sells on site, performs a survey of the premises to be 30 31 protected, or responds to alarm signal devices, burglar alarms, or cameras as 32 described in subdivision (5) or (29) of this section; (4) "Alarm systems apprentice" means any individual employed by an 33 alarm systems company who installs, services, or repairs on site as described 34 35 in subdivision (5) or (29) of this section that is supervised by an "alarm 36 systems technician", a "supervisor of technicians", or a "manager";

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- (5) "Alarm systems company" means any person, firm, association, or corporation which for a fee or other valuable consideration installs, services, sells on site, performs a survey of the premises to be protected, monitors, or responds to electrical, electronic, or mechanical alarm signal devices, burglar alarms, television cameras or still cameras used to manually or automatically signal or detect burglary, fire, breaking or entering, shoplifting, pilferage, theft, hold-up, or other illegal or unauthorized activity;
- 9 (6) "Alarm systems monitor" means any individual employed by an alarm 10 systems company who monitors or responds as described in subdivision (5) of 11 this section;
  - (7) "Alarm systems technician" means any individual employed by an alarm systems company who installs, services or repairs on site as described in subdivision (5) or (29) of this section;
  - (8) "Armored car company" means any person that provides armed security transportation and protection, from one (1) place or point to another place or point, of money, currency, coins, bullion, securities, bonds, jewelry, or other valuables;
  - (9) "Board" means the Arkansas Board of Private Investigators and Private Security Agencies;
  - (10) "Commissioned security officer" means any private security officer to whom a security officer commission has been issued by the board;
  - (11) "Firearm" means, as defined in Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary, a weapon from which a shot is discharged by gunpowder;
  - (12) "Guard company" means any person engaging in the business of or undertaking to provide a private watchman, guard, or street patrol service on a contractual basis for another person and performing any one (1) or more of the following or similar functions:
- 29 (A) Prevention of intrusion, entry, larceny, vandalism, abuse, 30 fire, or trespass on private property;
- 31 (B) Prevention, observation, or detection of any unauthorized 32 activity on private property;
  - (C) Control, regulation, or direction of the flow or movements of the public, whether by vehicle or otherwise, only to the extent and for the time directly and specifically required to assure the protection of property; or

- 1 (D) Protection of individuals from bodily harm;
- 2 (13) "Investigations company" means any person who engages in the 3 business or accepts employment to obtain or furnish information with
- 4 reference to:

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- 5 (A) Crime or wrongs done or threatened against the United States 6 or any state or territory of the United States;
- 7 (B) The identity, habits, conduct, business, occupation,
- 8 honesty, integrity, credibility, knowledge, trustworthiness, efficiency,
- 9 loyalty, activity, movement, whereabouts, affiliations, associations,
- 10 transactions, acts, reputation, or character of any person;
- 11 (C) The location, disposition, or recovery of lost or stolen 12 property;
- 13 (D) The cause or responsibility for fires, libels, losses,
- 14 accidents, damages, or injuries to persons or to property; or
- 15 (E) The securing of evidence to be used before any court, board, 16 officer, or investigating committee;
- 17 (14) "License" means a permit granted by the board entitling a person 18 to operate as a security services contractor, an investigations company, or 19 an alarm systems company;
  - (15) "Licensee" means any person to whom a license is granted under this chapter;
    - (16) "Manager" means, in the case of a corporation, an officer or supervisor, or, in the case of a partnership, a general or unlimited partner meeting the experience qualifications set forth in § 17-40-306 for managing a security services contractor or an investigations company;
    - (17) "NBFAA" means National Burglar and Fire Alarm Association, 7101 Wisconsin Avenue, Suite 901, Bethesda, MD 20814-4805, (301)907-3208;
  - (18) "NICET" means National Institute for Certification in Engineering Technologies, 1420 King Street, Alexander, VA 22314-2794, (703)684-2835;
- 30 (19) "Person" means an individual, firm, association, company, 31 partnership, corporation, nonprofit organization, institution, or similar 32 entity;
  - (20) "Private investigator" means any person who performs one (1) or more services as described in subdivision (13) of this section;
- 35 (21) "Private security officer" means any individual employed by a 36 security services contractor or the security department of a private business

- to perform the duties of a security guard, security watchman, security patrolman, or armored car quard;
  - (22) "Registrant" means an individual who has filed an application with the board to perform the duties of a private investigator, manager, or branch office manager;
  - (23) "Registration" means a permit granted by the board to an individual to perform the duties of a private investigator, manager, or branch office manager;
  - (24) "Security department of a private business" means the security department of any person, if the security department has as its general purpose the protection and security of its own property and grounds, and if it does not offer or provide security services to any other person;
  - (25) "Security officer commission" means an authorization granted by the board to an individual employed as a private security officer to carry a firearm;
- 16 (26) "Security services contractor" means any guard company or armored 17 car company;
  - (27) "Supervisor of technicians" means any individual employed by an alarm systems company who supervises "alarm systems technicians" or "alarm systems apprentices" and who may install, service, or repair on site as described in subdivision (5) of this section; and
  - (28) "Undercover agent" means an individual hired by another individual, partnership, corporation, or other business entity to perform a job for that individual, partnership, corporation, or other business entity and, while performing such job, to act as an undercover agent, an employee, or an independent contractor of a licensee, but supervised by a licensee; and
  - (29) "Single Station Alarm Systems Company" means any person, firm, association, or corporation which, for a fee or other valuable consideration, installs, services, or sells on site, fire, smoke or heat detectors to be installed in a one (1) or two (2) family dwelling or performs a survey of the premises to be protected, if the detectors are single station installations and not a part of or connected to any other detection device or system.

- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 17-40-309 is amended to read as follows: 17-40-309. License Classifications.
  - (a) No person may engage in any operation outside the scope of his

1 license.

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- 2 (b) For the purpose of defining the scope of licenses, the following 3 license classifications are established:
- 4 (1) Class A: Investigations company license, covering operations 5 as defined in § 17-40-102(13);
- 6 (2) Class B: Security services contractor license, covering 7 operations as defined in § 17-40-102(26);
- 8 (3) Class C: Covering the operations included within Class A and 9 Class B;
- 10 (4) Class D: A single individual operating as an investigations
  11 company with no other employees required to be licensed or registered under
  12 this chapter;
  - (5)(A) Class E Level 1: Alarm systems company license, covering operations as defined in § 17-40-102(5). Fire alarm license is restricted to structures for which applicable building and life safety codes do not mandate the installation of fire alarm systems, one (1) and two (2) family dwellings classified as "Group R3", in the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code.
- 18 (B) Class E Level 2: Alarm systems company license 19 covering operations as defined in § 17-40-102(5). Fire alarm license is 20 restricted to structures for which applicable building and life safety codes 21 do not mandate the installation of fire alarm systems, one (1) and two (2) family dwellings classified as "Group R3", "Group R1" (except buildings with 22 23 three (3) or more stories), "Group R2" (except buildings with three (3) or 24 more stories), "Group A" (except those that exceed fifteen thousand square 25 feet (15,000 sq.ft.)), "Group B" (except "highrise"), "Group E" (except those 26 that exceed fifteen thousand square feet (15,000 sq.ft.)), "Group F", "Group 27 M", and "Group S" in the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code.
- 28 (C) Class E Level 3: Alarm systems company license 29 covering operations as defined in § 17-40-102(5). Fire alarm license is 30 unrestricted.
- 31 (D) Class E-M: Alarm systems company license covering only 32 monitoring as defined in § 17-40-102(5).
- 33 (E) Class E-S: A single station alarm systems company
  34 license covering operations as defined by § 17-40-102(29). Fire alarm
  35 license is restricted to one (1) and two (2) family dwellings.
- 36 <u>(F) Class F-S: A single station alarm systems company</u>

- 1 license covering operations as defined by § 17-40-102(29) with no more than
- 2 <u>five (5) registered employees required to be registered under this chapter.</u>
- 3 Fire alarm license is restricted to one (1) and two (2) family dwellings.
- 4 (6)(A) Class F: An alarm systems company license covering
- 5 operations as defined in § 17-40-102(5) with no more than five (5) employees
- 6 required to be registered under this chapter. Fire alarm license is
- 7 restricted to structures for which applicable building and life safety codes
- 8 do not mandate installation of fire alarm systems and one (1) and two (2)

- 11 (B) Class F-M: Alarm systems company license covering only
- 12 monitoring as defined in  $\S$  17-40-102(5) with no more than five (5) persons

- 16 (c) A person licensed only as a security services contractor may not
- 17 make any investigation except as incidental to the theft, loss, embezzlement,
- 18 misappropriation, or concealment of any property which he has been hired or
- 19 engaged to protect.

- 21 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 17-40-318, concerning training requirements
- 22 for an alarm systems business, is amended by adding an additional subsection
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (f) The licensee or the licensee's manager of a Class E-S or Class F-S
- 25 <u>license shall demonstrate that he or she is knowledgeable in fire protection</u>
- 26 and the proper use and placement of single station fire and heat detectors by
