Arkansas Code 17-93-309 is amended to read as follows: 16 17-93-309. Revocation, suspension, or denial - Proceedings. 17 (a) (1) Any person may file a complaint with the board against any person having a license to practice as a physical therapist or as a physical 18 19 therapist assistant in this state charging that person with having violated 20 the provisions of § 17-93-308. 21 (2) The complaint shall set forth a specification of charges in 22 sufficient detail so as to disclose to the accused fully and completely the alleged acts of misconduct for which he is charged. 23 24 (2) Once a complaint has been received in the board office, the 25 board shall first send an advisory notice to the person allegedly committing 26 the violation informing the person of the complaint, and a statement 27 notifying the person that the person must reply to the board.
