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2	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
3	General Assembly that state law provides teachers the opportunity to seek
4	recognition by their school boards for negotiating personnel policies,
5	salaries and other matters; that school boards and their representatives
6	should not discourage efforts by teachers to exercise their rights under
7	Arkansas law; that some teachers in Arkansas have been threatened with a loss
8	of compensation for exercising teacher's rights; and that passage of this act
9	is necessary to ensure that teachers are not threatened by their employers
10	because of any actions taken by the teacher in exercising the teacher's
11	rights as guaranteed by state law. Therefore, an emergency is declared to
12	exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
13	public peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its
14	approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the
15	Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time
16	during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the
17	Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date
18	the last house overrides the veto.
