It is found and determined by the SECTION 9. 26 General Assembly that the state does not have the funds to support the 27 Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program in its current form; and that applicants graduating after December 31, 2000, will experience uncertainty regarding 28 29 eligibility for the Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program; and that many 30 applicants may be delayed in beginning their post-secondary education unless 31 changes in the scholarship program become effective in sufficient time to

31 <u>changes in the scholarship program become effective in sufficient time</u> 32 allow scholarship awards to be made to those students needing to make

33 enrollment decisions for the 2001-2002 academic year. Therefore, an

34 emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for

35 <u>the preservation of the public peace</u>, health and safety shall become

36 effective on *April 30, 2001*.
