24 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE
25 OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, A MAJORITY OF ALL MEMBERS
26 ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:

28 That the following is hereby proposed as an amendment to the
29 Constitution of the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the
30 electors of the state for approval or rejection at the next general election
31 for Senators and Representatives, if a majority of the electors voting thereon
32 at such election, adopt such amendment, the same shall become a part of the
33 Constitution of the State of Arkansas, to wit:

35 SECTION 1. The General Assembly is hereby authorized and required to
36 enact any laws necessary to provide equal, fair, equi table, and adequate

educational opportunities throughout the state.

SECTION 2. This amendment becomes effective on January 1, 2003.
