PROPOSING A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO
CHANGE LEGISLATIVE SESSIONS FROM
BIENNIAL TO ANNUAL SESSIONS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE
OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, A MAJORITY OF ALL MEMBERS
ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:

That the following is hereby proposed as an amendment to the
Constitution of the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the
electors of the state for approval or rejection at the next general election
for Senators and Representatives, if a majority of the electors voting thereon
at such election, adopt such amendment, the same shall become a part of the
Constitution of the State of Arkansas, to wit:

SECTION 1. Section 5 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of
Arkansas is amended to read as follows:

§ 5. Time of meeting.

The General Assembly shall meet at the seat of government ~~every two~~
~~years on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in November until said~~ each
year at 12:00 noon on the first Monday in March until the time be altered by
law.

SECTION 2. This amendment shall become effective January 1, 2003.
