22	SECTION 1. REAPPROPR	RIATION - GENERAL IMPROVEMENT FUND	. There is hereby	
23	appropriated, to the Ar	kansas Soil and Water Conservatio	n Commission, to be	
24	payable from the Genera	l Improvement Fund or its success	or fund or fund	
25	accounts, for the Arkan	sas Soil and Water Conservation C	ommission, the	
26	following:			
27	(A) Effective July	1, 2003, the balance of the appro	priation provided in	
28	Item (N) of Section 1 o	of Act 100 of 2001, for various Wa	ter Development Fund	
29	projects to assist loca	al communities in the development	of water supplies,	
30	distribution systems, d	rainage, flood control systems, a	nd water resources	
31	research, in a sum not	to exceed	\$8,028.	
32	(B) Effective July	1, 2003, the balance of the appro	priation provided in	
33	Item (0) of Section 1 o	of Act 100 of 2001, for various Wa	ter, Sewer, and Solid	
34	Waste Management Fund p	rojects to communities including	the development of	
35	water, sewer, and solid	waste management systems, in a s	um not to exceed	
36			\$42,619.	

1	(C) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in
2	Item (F) of Section 1 of Act 100 of 2001, for water treatment, supply,
3	distribution, storage systems and for irrigation and flood control projects,
4	in a sum not to exceed\$495,400.
5	(D) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in
6	Item (G) of Section 1 of Act 100 of 2001, for safe water, sanitary sewage and
7	solid waste disposal systems, in a sum not to exceed\$50,068.
8	(E) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in
9	Item (I) of Section 1 of Act 100 of 2001, for water treatment, supply, and
10	distribution projects, water storage tanks, irrigation and flood control
11	projects throughout the state, in a sum not to exceed\$306,000.
12	(F) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in
13	Item (J) of Section 1 of Act 100 of 2001, for a grant to fund a detailed
14	engineering feasibility study for the Lake Boydsville Project in Clay County,
15	in a sum not to exceed\$72,792.
16	(G) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in
17	Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 416 of 2001, for costs associated with the Osage
18	Basin Wastewater System development to include preliminary engineering,
19	environmental studies and acquisition of the treatment plant site, in a sum
20	not to exceed\$353,457.
21	(H) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in
22	Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 1128 of 2001, for Natural Resource Digital Data,
23	in a sum not to exceed\$486,572.
24	(I) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in
25	Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 1109 of 2001, for costs associated with the
26	Osage Basin Wastewater System development to include preliminary engineering,
27	environmental studies and acquisition of the treatment plant site, in a sum
28	not to exceed\$843.
29	(J) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in
30	Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 489 of 2001, for the Union County Conservation
31	District for costs associated with an information, education and technical
32	assistance program in the five county area of South Arkansas in which the
33	Sparta Aquifer has been designated a critical ground water area, in a sum not
34	to exceed\$190,057.
35	(K) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in
36	Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 1315 of 2001, for costs associated with the Lake

1	Boydsville Project, in a sum not to exceed\$33,790		
2	(L) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in		
3	Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 377 of 2001, for the Arkansas Water Development		
4	Fund for various water supply, distribution, and research efforts, in a sum		
5	not to exceed\$257,500.		
6	(M) Effective July 1, 2003, the balance of the appropriation provided in		
7	Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 422 of 2001, for construction and associated		
8	costs of the Wooster Water Extension Project, in a sum not to exceed		
9	\$5,619		
10			
11	SECTION 2. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor		
12	obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects		
13	described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available		
14	therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and		
15	agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and		
16	donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or		
17	funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State		
18	Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects		
19	enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds		
20	otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General		
21	Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall		
22	not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.		
23	(B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing		
24	Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue		
25	Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of this State		
26	and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration,		
27	as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any		
28	funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law.		
29			
30	SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly		
31	that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained		
32	in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this ac		
33	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations		
34	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by		
35	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral		
36	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or		

1	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
2	
3	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
4	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
5	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that previous
6	General Assemblies have provided appropriations for the projects provided or
7	enumerated in this act; that certain appropriations will expire before the
8	adjournment of the General Assembly; and that if such appropriations expire,
9	the projects and programs authorized herein will cease thereby depriving the
10	citizens of the State of the benefits to be derived from such projects.
11	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
12	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
13	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its
14	passage and approval. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the
15	Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time
16	during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the
17	Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date
18	the last house overrides the veto.
