19	AN ACT TO PROTECT VETERANS FROM IDENTITY THEFT BY	
20	MAKING MILITARY SERVICE DISCHARGE RECORDS FILED	
21	WITH THE COUNTY RECORDER CONFIDENTIAL; AND FOR	
22	OTHER PURPOSES.

25	TO PROTECT VETERANS FROM IDENTITY THEFT	
26	BY MAKING MILITARY SERVICE DISCHARGE	
27	RECORDS FILED WITH THE COUNTY RECORDER	
28	CONFIDENTIAL.

30	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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32	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 14-2-102, regarding records of military	
33	discharges, is amended to add additional subsections to read as follows:	
34	(c)(1) A military service discharge record or DD Form 214 for a	
35	veteran discharged from service less than seventy (70) years from the current	t
36	date and filed with the county recorder shall be confidential and may be	

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1	viewed or reproduced only by:
2	(A) The veteran;
3	(B) The veteran's spouse or child;
4	(C) A person with a signed and notarized authorization
5	from the veteran;
6	(D) A county or state veterans' service officer that is
7	assisting the veteran or the veteran's family with a veteran's benefit
8	application; or
9	(E) A person authorized by the court to view or copy the
10	military service discharge record or DD Form 214 upon presentation of a court
11	order.
12	(2) The county recorder shall record the names and addresses of
13	all persons viewing or copying a military service discharge record or Form DD
14	214 under this subsection (c).
15	(3) No fee shall be charged for reproduction cost under this
16	subsection (c).
17	(d)(1) A military service discharge record for a veteran discharged
18	from service more than seventy (70) years from the current date and filed
19	with the county recorder shall be public record.
20	(2) No fee shall be charged for reproduction cost under this
21	subsection (d).
22	(e) The county recorder may maintain a record book that contains any
23	of the following information about veterans for public record:
24	(A) Name;
25	(B) Rank;
26	(C) Unit of military service;
27	(D) Dates of military service;
28	(E) Medals conferred upon the veteran; and
29	(F) Awards conferred upon the veteran.
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31	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 25-19-105(b), regarding documents exempted
32	from the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act, is amended to add an additional
33	subdivision to read as follows:
34	(15) Military service discharge records or DD Form 214 for
35	veterans discharged from service less than seventy (70) years from the
36	current date and filed with the county recorder as provided under § 14-2-102.

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2	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that for many years, veterans were
4	advised to file their military service discharge records or DD Form 214 with
5	the court recorder; that these forms contain sensitive information that can
6	be used by identity thieves to obtain credit in the veteran's name or
7	otherwise defraud the veteran or his or her family; in recent years, the
8	incident of identity theft has increased; that incidents of identity thieves
9	using the military service discharge records or DD Form 214 to obtain credit
10	in the veteran's name or otherwise defraud the veteran or his or her family
11	has occurred; that the effects on the veteran and the veteran's family are
12	devastating; and that this act is immediately necessary to protect veterans
13	and their families from identity theft by making military service discharge
14	records or DD Form 214 filed with the county recorder confidential and not
15	subject to the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act. Therefore, an emergency
16	is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
17	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
18	on:
19	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
20	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
21	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
22	bill; or
23	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
24	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
