Arkansas Code § 17-29-302(a), concerning the qualifications 8 of funeral directors, is amended to read as follows: 9 (a) Every person who desires to engage in the business of funeral 10 directing in this state shall: 11 (1) Be at least eighteen (18) years of age; 12 (2) Be a graduate of an accredited high school or the equivalent thereof; 13 14 (3) Have served as an apprentice funeral director for not less 15 than twenty-four (24) months in the State of Arkansas under the direct 16 personal supervision of an Arkansas-licensed funeral director. Completion of 17 the requirement to be a graduate of a school of embalmers as set forth in § 18 17-29-301(a)(3) may be substituted for twelve (12) of the twenty-four (24) 19 months' apprenticeship established herein; (4) Make application to the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral 20 21 Directors and attach the fee as prescribed in § 17-29-208; and 22 (5) Present himself or herself before the board at a time and 23 place fixed by the board and make a passing grade on both the written and 24 oral examinations. 25 26 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-29-304(b), concerning the requirements 27 of funeral directors, is amended to read as follows: 28 (b)(1) No license shall be issued to operate a full service funeral 29 establishment by the board unless the establishment has employed a full-time 30 person licensed as a funeral director. 31 (2) If the establishment is a part of a multiunit enterprise 32 within this state, only one (1) establishment within the multiunit enterprise 33 must have a full-time person licensed as funeral director, provided the full-34 time licensed person is reasonably accessible to the branch establishment. 35 36 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-29-311(a), concerning violations, is

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1 amended to read as follows:

2 (a) The State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors may issue 3 letters of reprimand or caution, refuse to issue or renew a license, or may 4 suspend or revoke any license for the practice of embalming or funeral 5 directing, or may place the holder thereof on a term of probation after 6 proper hearing upon finding the holder of the license to be guilty of acts of 7 commission or omission, including the following: 8 (1) Conviction of a felony; 9 (2) Misrepresentations made or fraud committed as a holder of a 10 license; 11 (3) False or misleading advertising; 12 (4) Solicitation of dead human bodies by the licensee, his or her agents, assistants, or employees, whether the solicitation occurs after 13 death or while death is impending, providing that this prohibition shall not 14 15 be deemed to prohibit general advertising; 16 (5) Employment directly or indirectly of an apprentice, agent, 17 assistant, employee, or other person, on a part-time or full-time basis or on 18 a commission for the purpose of calling upon individuals or institutions by 19 whose influence dead human bodies may be turned over to a particular funeral 20 establishment; 21 (6) The direct or indirect payment or offer of payment of a 22 commission by the licensee, his or her agents, assistants, or employees for 23 the purpose of securing business; (7) Allowing personnel unlicensed pursuant to this subchapter to 24 25 execute contracts for funeral service; 26 (8) Aiding or abetting an unlicensed person to practice 27 embalming or funeral directing; 28 (9) Violation of any provision of this subchapter and § 17-29-29 201 et seq.; 30 (10) Violation of any state law or municipal or county ordinance or regulation affecting the handling, custody, care, transportation, or final 31 32 disposition of dead human bodies; 33 (11) Fraud or misrepresentation in obtaining or renewing a 34 license; 35 (12) Refusing to properly release a dead human body to the 36 custody of the person or entity having the legal right to effect such a
