14 AN ACT TO ALLOW CADETS OF THE DEPARTMENT
15 OF ARKANSAS STATE POLICE TO FILE PARKING
16 VIOLATIONS AND TRAFFIC ACCIDENT REPORTS.
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 12-9-110 is amended to read as follows:

23 12-9-110. Training of civilians to file parking violations and traffic
24 accident reports.

25 (a) The Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training
26 shall, by regulation, establish the qualifications, including minimum
27 training standards, for persons performing law enforcement-related duties
28 pursuant to this section within cities of the first class and within other
29 areas of the State of Arkansas for cadets that are appointed by the Director
30 of the Department of Arkansas State Police.

31 (b) Cities of the first class and the Department of Arkansas State
32 Police may employ persons who do not meet certification requirements
33 prescribed by the commission, and such persons may:

34 (1) Issue citations for parking violations occurring within his
35 or her respective jurisdiction ~~the corporate limits of the city;~~ and

36 (2) Prepare traffic accident reports.



1 (c) Persons employed under this section shall not carry firearms or
2 take any other official law enforcement action except as prescribed by this
3 section.

4 (d)(1) Persons performing law enforcement duties pursuant to this
5 section shall complete all training and meet all minimum standards prescribed
6 by the commission for the exercise of such authority.

7 (2) However, the department and cities of the first class may
8 establish more stringent training requirements.

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
